

## Membership Dues Rates

## As of June 1, 2022, our new dues rates and policies are as follows:

- We will no longer be pro-rating dues based on a July 1 June 30 membership year. All new members will pay the full dues annually based on the month they sign up. For example, if you sign on in March, your renewal will be 12 months later. Quarterly or monthly members will not be affected by this change.
- Each member can change their renewal date one time, if they prefer based on the needs of their business. For instance, if you sign up in March but your budgets renew in January, you can request to change your renewal to January, once you sign up.
- The BBRC Board of Directors voted to change the member dues levels for the first time in a decade at the May 2022 Board Meeting to align our rates with other chambers of our size and impact. Our programming and member benefits have increased substantially over the past decade, as well as staffing, and the modest dues increases help support those changes.
