



Freedom Place: A New Home and a New Beginning for Women in Need

This Fall, Catholic Charities Maine (CCM) is honored to begin a new chapter at **Freedom Place**, as the behavioral health provider of life recovery services in partnership with property owner, Developers Collaborative. Located at 66 State Street in Portland, Freedom Place provides **safe**, **supportive housing and services for up to 38 women** committed to recovery.

"We want every woman here to feel safe, supported, and empowered to move forward."

Freedom Place is more than a roof overhead — it is a place of healing, dignity, and hope. Here, women can find stability and encouragement as they work toward recovery from trauma, substance use, homelessness, previous incarceration, and other challenges that have impacted their health and wellbeing. Through compassionate care and connection to essential services, residents will receive the guidance and community they need to continue on their path to wellness.



"Freedom Place gives women the support they need to heal and rebuild their lives," said Kelly Butler, Regional **Director** - Southern Region Behavioral Health Network. "We want every woman here to feel safe, supported, and empowered to move forward."




Program Highlights

Powerful Partnership Brings Smiles to Behavioral Health Clients

CCM's Behavioral Health Network in Fairfield is excited to launch a new partnership that will bring brighter smiles and healthier futures to the community. Beginning this month, a mobile dental clinic will provide on-site care for clients one to two times

This collaboration came to life thanks to the initiative of Emma Hill, Clinical Supervisor, who reached out to Maine Oral Health & Wellness to explore ways to provide easier access to dental care for persons in need. It's a powerful reminder of what can happen when community organizations connect!

The clinic is run by Kala Myers-French, an independent hygienist and owner of the fully equipped RV dental office. Together with another hygienist who also has a mental health background, they can see up to ten patients a day, ensuring each visit is personalized and comfortable. Thoughtful touches — like hour-long appointments and warm rice packs — will help patients feel cared for and relaxed.

Services include screenings, cleanings, X-rays, sealants, periodontal care, temporary fillings, and decay-arresting treatments. The clinic accepts MaineCare and Delta Dental insurance and even has limited grant funding available for those without insurance, ensuring access for all clients who need care.

"This partnership is so inspiring. Kala's compassion and dedication are exactly what our clients need," says Hill.

We're so grateful for this collaboration, which perfectly reflects our mission: to meet people in need, where they are, with compassion.

Catholic Charities Maine Selected for Light the World Giving Machine Initiative

Catholic Charities Maine is honored to be one of just five organizations in Maine selected to participate in this year's Light the World Giving Machine Initiative, a global effort by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to make giving easy, meaningful, and fun.

From November 20 to December 10, two Giving Machines will be located at the Maine Mall in South Portland. A Giving Machine is a unique, charity-focused vending machine that allows individuals to donate essential items and services to those in need. Unlike traditional vending machines, these provide donation cards representing items such as socks, groceries, bicycles, medical care, or educational resources. Donors select an item through a touchscreen interface and complete the transaction via credit or debit card, with 100% of donations going directly to the charity.

Through our Giving Machine cards, donors can choose to support CCM programs by providing:

- Walker with Seat
- Grocery Box
- New Bike to get to work

Bill Hager Receives National Honor for Service to Children

For the past five years, Bill has led our St. Elizabeth's and St. Louis child development centers, both rated 5-star facilities, the State's highest ranking, under his stewardship. Earlier in his career, he spent ten years as

site manager at St. Louis, gaining deep experience in supporting low-income families and children with behavioral or developmental challenges.

What sets Bill apart is how deeply he lives out servant leadership — from balancing budgets and onboarding new families to packing snacks and leading toddlers in instructional dances.

Under his leadership, the centers have embraced an inclusive mission: caring for children from all backgrounds, including those with special needs, and ensuring they receive early education, stability, and nurturing care. Bill has also led policy coalitions on childcare reform, raising awareness across Maine for children's issues and advocating for better support for early childhood educators.
