Read Magazines with Libby

Magazines can be borrowed through your regular Libby account. A patron only needs to open their Libby account, select Bentley Memorial Library and browse for magazines. When you see the cover of a magazine you'd like to read, tap the cover and then tap borrow. When you wish to read the magazine tap the shelf icon. Tap the middle of the screen to view a page, tap the left or right side of the screen to navigate through the magazine.

Magazines are always available to read, but they must be subscriptions that Bentley Memorial Library has subscribed to. These magazines will not count

towards your checkout limit. Also, magazines automatically return at the end of the loan period so there are no overdue issues.

The Libby app is a great way to access magazines. Please remember that Bentley has print copies of 50 magazine titles and 6 newspapers.



eGO The Palace Project

Last month the Connecticut State Library purchased over 3,000 new titles bringing the total number of online books to over 48,000 items. These books include mysteries, thrillers, and backlist bestsellers. Our patrons are often looking for a standalone mystery or a mystery series – eGO Palace Project has both!

Whether it's a cozy mystery, police procedural, or hard-boiled mysteries, they are all in Palace. All of your favorite characters including Hercule Poirot (Agatha Christie), Danny Patrick (Don Winslow), Agent Pendergast (Preston & Child), Vera Stanhope (Ann Cleeves), Adam Dalgliesh (P.D. James), and so many more are here!

To access the eGO Palace Project, download the "Palace Project" app on your mobile device from the App Store or Google Play, then log in using your library card number and PIN to browse and borrow ebooks and audiobooks from the Connecticut State Library's eGO collection; you can access both your local library's collection and the statewide eGO collection through this app.



Wowbrary is a nonprofit service that provides you free weekly emails about your local library's most recent acquisitions including new books, DVDs, and CDs. Our service reaches both avid library patrons and those who haven't used libraries in years. Wowbrary serves as an attractive online version of the new-book shelf, but one that spans all library branches, includes items that are checked out, and comes by convenient email. By showcasing the latest arrivals and allowing patrons to click through directly to the library website, Wowbrary makes it easy to scan quickly what's new and encourages greater library use.

Signing up to receive weekly emails

Go to https://www.wowbrary.org and type your ZIP code in the upper left box. Then hit the Go button. Wowbrary will display Bentley Memorial Library.

Join us for Storytime in February! Come and enjoy stories and a simple craft. Feel free to bring your own snack or lunch. Registration is not required.




major changes occurred both in fashion and in society. Immerse yourself in Downton Abbey, where we will explore all of the changing fashions of this intriguing period.




