Dear First Selectman and Members of the Board of Selectmen:

We write as six-year residents of Bolton to express our strong support for the proposed redesign of the Interstate 384 / Route 44 / Route 6 interchange. This community’s quiet roads, trails, and open spaces are among its greatest assets, and it is precisely because we care about Bolton’s future that we urge the Board’s full support for this long-overdue improvement.

Safety is our foremost concern. High vehicle speeds, limited sight lines, and inadequate lane delineation create conditions that invite serious accidents. A redesigned interchange with modern geometric standards and traffic calming measures would meaningfully reduce crash frequency and severity for all users.

Equally important is the opportunity to improve bicycle and pedestrian connectivity. The current configuration effectively severs safe non-motorized access through this gateway. Enhanced crosswalks, protected bike lanes, and clear pedestrian paths would allow residents and visitors to reach Route 44 businesses and connect to the town’s trail network — including the Hop River State Park Trail — safely. This is both a quality-of-life and economic issue, as improved access supports the vitality of Bolton’s commercial corridor.

We respectfully urge the Board to champion this project and communicate to the Connecticut Department of Transportation that Bolton’s residents stand behind this redesign — for a safer, more connected community for generations to come.

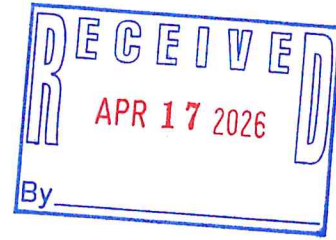

Bolton Congregational Church, United Church of Christ is requesting the use of the roundabout circle driveway behind town hall for overflow seating for our 2026 Lobster bake that is scheduled to potentially take place June 13 2026 from 5-7pm. We are also requesting that in approving of this request, you may also approve of the request for us to offer a cash bar to the patrons visiting the lobster boil where we will have Beer and Wine available for purchase and distributed in plastic containers to those seated outdoors.

We will have one single bar location located inside of our hall, with a licensed and insured bartender behind the bar, we will also require photo identification and wrist bands for any and all patrons wishing to purchase any alcoholic beverages, and all beverages will be served in a clear plastic container. Offerings will be limited to 4 different beers, and 4 different wines only. No outside beer or wine will be allowed, and only those who have purchased a dinner ticket may enter and utilize the cash bar on the premises.

BCC, UCC will provide the town with any and all insurance waivers and certificates as we get closer to the event, as well as any and all other permits requested. Further this event will be fully under a commercial food license from the Eastern Highland Health District, and served by Serve Safe certified individuals.
