pressure to work towards improved heart health. Patrons are also encouraged, but not required, to


register with EHHD to receive emailed resources related to a healthy blood pressure and information about upcoming educational programs sponsored by the Health District.


Bentley Memorial Library the building turns 50! Celebration on Thursday, November 13th 6:30

and introduces us to some family recipes. Join us on **Wednesday**, **November 19th at noon**. Copies of the book are now available at the library.


