
Earth Day is an annual event to demonstrate support for environmental protection.

Ray will discuss the natural history and behavior as well as some of the results of recent research concerning Connecticut's widespread but elusive resident wild feline.

Steve Penny will lead us through an exploration of Native American history focusing on tribes of the eastern United States. This presentation will focus on the 40 years between the Pequot War and King Philip's War, when the Narragansetts and Mohegans battled over control of the former Pequot land. Plan to join us for the third presentation on May 8th which will examine King Phillip's War and it's effect on the New England tribes.

The 39 Steps By John Buchan

<u>The 39 Steps</u> is one of the earliest 'man on the run' thrillers. Buchan introduces Richard Hannay who is caught up in a dramatic race against a plot to devastate the British war effort. <u>The 39 Steps</u> is Buchan's best known novel and has been continuously in print since it's first publication in 1915, inspiring 3 film adaptations.


