- Due to popular demand, the Large Print collection has been separated from the general Adult Fiction books. All Large Print novels will be shelved alphabetically by author at the beginning of the Adult Fiction section.

## Libby, Hoopla and Downloadable Resources

Bentley is pleased to offer downloadable books and videos through both Libby and Hoopla. These apps have been very popular and in the last six months 5,145 items have been downloaded. This is exciting for the library as we always attempt to promote reading in any format. These downloads do come with a cost that the library budget absorbs. The 5,145 downloaded items cost the library \$7,781.73. We encourage this incredible amount of reading and ask only one thing: Please download only items that you actually plan to use as any download, read or not, is charged to the library. The Palace Project is also an option for downloading books at no cost to the library.



## eGO The Palace Project Download the app for free books!

The Connecticut State Library now has over 54,000 titles in its collection of online books. These books include mysteries, thrillers, and backlist bestsellers. Our patrons are often looking for a standalone mystery or a mystery series – eGO Palace Project has both!

To access the eGO Palace Project, download the "Palace Project" app on your mobile device from the App Store or Google Play, then log in using your library card number and PIN to browse and borrow ebooks and audiobooks from the Connecticut State Library's eGO collection; you can access both your local library's collection and the statewide eGO collection through this app.


### The Search Begins Scavenger Hunt


**Bolton Public Schools Art Show**
