Bentley Memorial Library is Fine-Free

On May 1st Bentley Memorial Library became a fine-free library. The library joined over 130 other CT libraries in this initiative. The Bolton Board of Selectmen, at an April meeting, voted to have the library become fine free. All patrons must continue to honor due dates to ensure that fellow patrons will have equal access to our collection. Previous



fines for late fees will be forgiven and no new late fees will accrue. Patrons will still be responsible for replacing any lost or damaged materials. Thanks go to the Library Board of Trustees for initiating this change.



Museum Key Goes Operational! Bentley's new online Museum Pass Registration System

Our new online museum pass reservation system has launched and is ready for use. The system works much the same as our previous system,

Museum Tix. The link for Museum Key is posted on the library website, and at the bottom of this posting. This will allow patrons to sign out a museum pass from their mobile, tablet, laptop or desktop. Patrons may select their choice of museum to visit, the date they wish to visit and print their pass from home or at the library. Some museums will accept a screen shot of your reservation, but Bentley strongly encourages you to print your pass. Contact any staff member at Bentley if you have questions.



Acorn Library Catalog App

Bentley Memorial Library, along with Bibliomation, offers a free mobile app which allows you to quickly & easily access Bentley Memorial Library's catalog! Simply go to the Apple App Store or to the Google Play Store, search for the Acorn app and download the app. If you already

have Acorn on your smart device, please check to insure your app has been updated to the February 7th version. Using the Acorn app will simplify text communications between Bibliomation and the patron.

The **Acorn Library Catalog mobile app** is streamlined & efficient, making it easy to:

- View & request holds
- View & renew items checked out

Acorn Library Catalog also ...

- Puts Bentley Memorial Library's contact info right in the palm of your hand
- Includes a digital barcode version of your library card
- Allows patrons to create their own personal title lists (e.g. "To Be Read" or "Books My Friends Recommend")

Push Notifications for Acorn

- Get notified when holds are ready or when items are due.
- Go to settings and select notifications. Scroll down to find Acorn Catalog. Click on Acorn and select 'Allow Notifications'.
- Push notifications are becoming essential as cell providers are not supporting text messaging from library consortiums (Bibliomation et al) and notifications using text messaging will not go through

Explore the Future of Bolton Heritage Farm

Public Presentation & Display at the Library Hosted by the Bolton Heritage Farm Commission

Tuesday, June 3rd at 6:30

Join us at Bentley Memorial Library for a special presentation introducing residents to an exciting new phase in the life of the Farm—highlighting a master site plan and proposed connectivity trail, funded through the Local Transportation Capital Improvement

Program (LOTCIP). Throughout the month of June, the Library will feature a special exhibit showcasing the plan and visual display, allowing residents to explore the evolving vision for Bolton Heritage Farm at their own pace.

The evening will include:

- A brief presentation offering background on the Farm, including historical highlights, future goals, and how the LOTCIP trail project fits into the broader master site plan.
- Details about the Town's 250th Anniversary and the Farm's role in those celebrations.
- Q&A session for community feedback and questions.
- A guided walk of the Farm site following the presentation (weather permitting).

This is a wonderful opportunity for residents to gain insight into the future of one of Bolton's most treasured landmarks and to get involved in shaping what's ahead.
