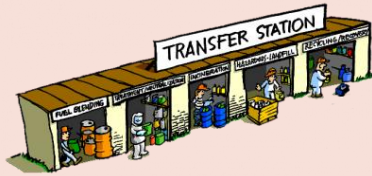

SCRAP METAL - APRIL 27 TO MAY 01, 2026

Items for collection must be curbside by Sunday Night, April 26.



Curbside scrap metal collection will be held the week of April 27- May 01, 2025. Items for collection must be curbside by Sunday Night, April 26. Noncombustible items such as appliances and other metal items weighing up to 100 pounds are acceptable. Gas grill propane tanks need to have the caps removed. Unacceptable items include motor vehicle parts, machinery, and items weighing more than 100 pounds. Please remember this collection is for scrap metal only, not for bulk waste.

Please note that all acceptable scrap metals will be picked up by Friday afternoon. If your items are not picked up by 4 pm on Friday, then you are responsible for getting rid of the items. Any items not picked up can be brought to the transfer station during their scheduled open times. (You will need to purchase a transfer station ticket if this occurs.)

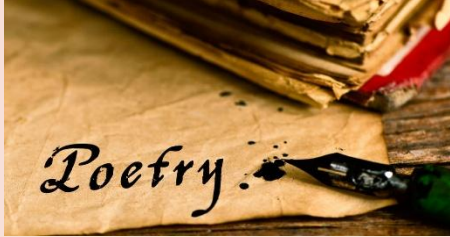

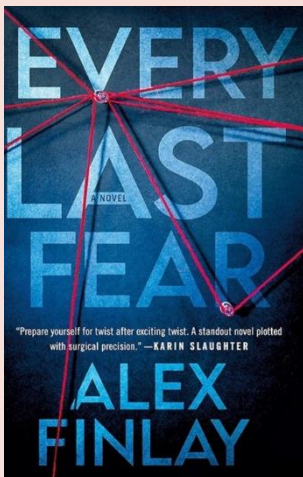

Questions and Answers

- Why did we reduce the voting hours for referenda?** The reduced hours will save about \$1,500 per referendum. Based on last year, there could be more referenda this fiscal year than the 4 that the registrars budgeted for. Additionally, taxpayers stated that they do not like the high cost of each referendum (previously about \$5,500 each). The Town ordinance currently establishes referendum voting hours from 12:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. State statutes and the Town ordinance authorize the Board of Selectmen to set the starting time for referenda between 6:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon, and the Board may permit longer voting periods at its discretion. This schedule was developed in collaboration with the Registrars of Voters.
- Why do voting locations change for the referenda?** For the health and safety of the poll workers. When the referenda extended into July last year, temperatures reached over 90° in the St. Maurice Parish Center. The extreme temperatures forced the last-minute move to Bolton Congregational Church's Chandler Hall which is air-conditioned. To avoid confusion this year, we will move to the air-conditioned Commons at Bolton High School if the referenda continue into July.

The Bolton Recreation Department is seeking both full-time and part-time seasonal head lifeguards. Under the direct supervision of the Recreation Director, lifeguards are responsible for the everyday safety and wellbeing of patrons at Indian Notch Lake. Lifeguards will strictly enforce all policies, procedures, and regulations with all patrons. Staff will work closely with other town staff on a daily basis and perform all rescues and follow-up procedures.

RECREATION - FULL & PART-TIME LIFEGUARD | \$17.00/hour

The Bolton Recreation Department is seeking both full-time and part-time seasonal summer lifeguards. Under the direct supervision of the head lifeguard, lifeguards are responsible for the everyday safety and wellbeing of patrons at Indian Notch Lake. Lifeguards will strictly enforce all policies, procedures and regulations with all patrons. Staff will work closely with other town staff on a daily basis and perform all rescues and follow up procedures including the use of follow up procedures, paper work and other available equipment. Lifeguards must have their Lifeguard Training + Waterfront certification as well as Standard First Aid, and CPR for the Professional Rescuer.

RECREATION - SUMMER CAMP COUNSELOR | \$17.00/hour

The Bolton Recreation Department is seeking both full time and part time seasonal summer camp counselors. Under the direct supervision of the camp director, a Counselor is responsible for the supervision of campers, promoting and actively participating in all camp activities, providing a safe and fun learning environment, and serving as a positive role model for campers. We are seeking motivated team members who believe deeply in the organization's mission and who display a record of achievement in effective supervision & management of youth as it pertains to this position, building positive relationships and ensuring the safety and well-being of people of all ages. Hours of work will vary between the hours of 7:30am and 5:30pm.

The Bolton Recreation department is seeking a full time camp director. This position is a nine week position with one week to prepare summer camp and eight weeks of working one on one with community members and staff of the camp. The director will work full time, creating weekly lesson plans and be sure all counselors are following the rules and regulations of the job, working with vendors on workshop and field trip days and more. The camp director will work directly under the recreation director.
