The Town of Bolton is proud to announce Stable Studio Tattoo as our Business of the Month for September.

Stable Studio Tattoo, owned and operated by artist Kelly Green, has been a creative cornerstone in Bolton since opening its doors on Friday, July 13, 2018. With a passion for art and nearly two decades of tattooing experience, Kelly created the studio as a space for like-minded artists to come together and share their craft in a welcoming and inspiring environment.



Kelly's journey into tattooing began in 2002, shortly after graduating high school. Always fascinated with art, she found tattooing to be the perfect blend of creativity and personal expression. After tattooing throughout Connecticut for over 16 years, she decided it was time to open her own shop—and Bolton was the perfect place. Having recently purchased a home and started a family, Kelly wanted to put down roots in a community where her family could grow. She also saw an opportunity to bring something new to the area, since there were no tattoo shops in Bolton, Coventry, Andover, or Columbia.

The studio is primarily custom and appointment-based, though walk-ins are welcomed when possible. Stable Studio also hosts exciting events, including Flash Days, where artists design one-day-only tattoos—sometimes turning them into fundraisers to support local nonprofits. For those seeking a little spontaneity, the studio offers a playful “Get What You Get” gumball machine, where a quarter reveals your next tattoo design at random.

FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE

Real Estate tax bills, based on the temporary rate of 31 mills, were sent out at the beginning of August. **These bills MUST be paid by September 2nd.** If not paid by then, interest will be added to the account. Please go to the Tax Collector's department on the website on how interest is calculated.

If you use your banks bill pay, please be aware that a check is mailed to us without a postmark. If we receive ANY payment after September 2nd without a postmark it will be considered late. Please see payment options under the Tax Collector's department for other means of paying. Interest cannot be waived per state statute. Failure to receive a tax bill does not relieve the taxpayer from the responsibility of paying taxes or interest.


If your mortgage company will be paying your tax bill, the tax bill went to them for payment. If you have questions as to whether they will be paying the bill, you should contact your mortgage company to find out.

The amount due on your tax bill, as shown above, is currently due and will need to be paid by September 2nd, 2025 to avoid interest.

MOTOR VEHICLE/PERSONAL PROPERTY/SUPPLEMENTAL REAL ESTATE TAX BILLS

Motor Vehicle, Personal Property, and the remaining balance due on Real Estate Accounts will be billed by the end of September to be paid in October with a delinquent date of November 3rd. These bills will be based on the recently adopted mill rate of 32.3.

TOWN OF BOLTON ASSESSOR'S NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS

DECLARING PERSONAL PROPERTY: All persons liable to pay taxes are notified to declare all tangible personal property owned by them on October 1, 2025. Non-residents are required to declare property located in Bolton for any three months preceding 10/1/2025. Declarations are mailed to all property owners previously on record. Failure to receive a form does not negate the requirement to declare. Failure to declare by November 3, 2025, will result in a 25% PENALTY assessment. Extension request must be received by 11/3/2025.

All declaration forms will be in the Assessor's Office and online at www.boltonct.gov on September 22, 2025.

Per (CGS §12-110), the Board of Assessment Appeals will meet on Tuesday, 9/9/2025 at 6:00 pm, in the Tax & Assessment Office in the Lower Level of Town Hall, to hear motor vehicle appeals on the 2024 Grand List. Appeal applications may be submitted to the Assessor's Office by 1:00 pm, Friday, 9/5/2025. Walk-ins are also permitted. Per 12-71(b)(g)(2), only the MSRP can be appealed. Appeal applications are available on the BAA page of the town's website, <https://town.boltonct.gov/>, and at the Assessor's Office.

TRUSTS PRESENTATION

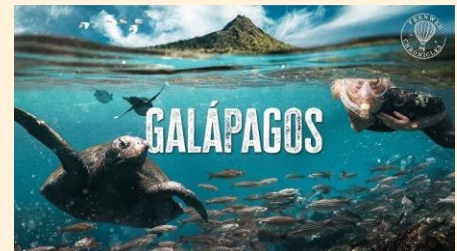
Tuesday, September 9 at 10 a.m.

New this year, Generation Power CT (formerly Operation Fuel) applications can now be completed through Bolton Senior and Social Services. 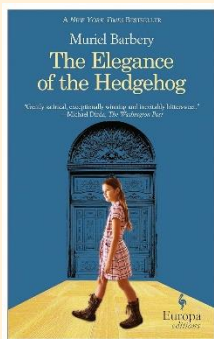
