TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE

Notice is hereby given to the taxpayers of the Town of Bolton that the taxes for the 2024 GL Supplemental Motor Vehicle Tax Billing shall become due and payable on January 1, 2026. The Tax Collector's office is in the Bolton Town Hall, 222 Bolton Center Rd, Bolton, CT, lower level.

Office hours for payments are as follows:

Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday: 8:30 a.m. - 4:00 p.m.

Tuesday: 8:30 a.m. - 6:30 p.m.

Friday: 8:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.

Payments must be received or postmarked by February 2, 2026, to avoid interest. Interest at the rate of 1.5% per month will be charged for all taxes remaining unpaid. Interest starts accruing from January 1, 2026 the date the taxes become due and payable. Minimum interest charge is \$2.00 per bill.

Failure to receive a bill does not invalidate the tax or interest per CT State Statute. Please call if you believe you have one due or if you have any questions at 860-649-8066 x 6101.
