
THE SEARCH BEGINS- SCAVENGER HUNT





BOLTON CENTER SCHOOL - 2026-2027 KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Bolton Center School will hold Kindergarten Registration for the 2026-2027 school year in the Main Office starting Monday, February 23rd. Parents will need to contact the main office at 860-643-2411 and speak with Judy Ramsdell to schedule an appointment for registration. We encourage parents to access the registration forms online via our website (www.boltonpublicschools.com) and complete them prior to coming to the school office.

Children must be 5 years old on or before September 1, 2026 to be eligible. Please bring the following documents:

- Child's Birth Certificate
- Proof of parents' residency (see Bolton Residency Requirements on our website)
- Current immunization and physical information

Preschool Screening and Child Find

Bolton Public Schools will be holding a screening for preschool children

Who can participate?

1. **Peer Model:** Would you like your child to be considered as a peer model for the 2026-2027 preschool class? In order to be considered as a possible peer model, your child will need to be screened. We are looking for 3- and 4-year-olds who demonstrate age-appropriate communication, social, play, and motor skills. Children must turn 3 or 4 years of age by August 26, 2026 and should not be eligible for kindergarten. Preference will be given to Bolton residents.
2. **Child Find:** Do you have any concerns about your child's development? We are able to screen for possible developmental delays and will determine whether your child is functioning within age-appropriate limits or is in need of further evaluation. This process is just a screening, not a formal evaluation.

What do you need to know about the screening?

The screening will take place at Bolton Center School on Wednesday, March 11 and Thursday, March 12. Screening times are 12:30-1:00 and 1:15-1:45. The screening takes about 30 minutes and will take place in the preschool classroom. Please sign your child in at the main office at your assigned screening date and time, then wait in the foyer. The preschool team will meet you in the foyer and take your child to the preschool classroom. Through play, the preschool team will look to gather information regarding your child's communication, social, play, and motor skills. While your child is playing, you will wait in the school foyer and complete a developmental history form.

How can you sign your child up for the screening?

If you are interested in having your preschool child screened as either a peer model or Child Find, please complete and return the Preschool Screening Application by **Friday, March 6, 2026**. The application is available on the district website: www.boltonpublicschools.com. Once your application has been received, administration will contact you via email with your assigned screening date and time. Applications can be emailed or mailed to:
