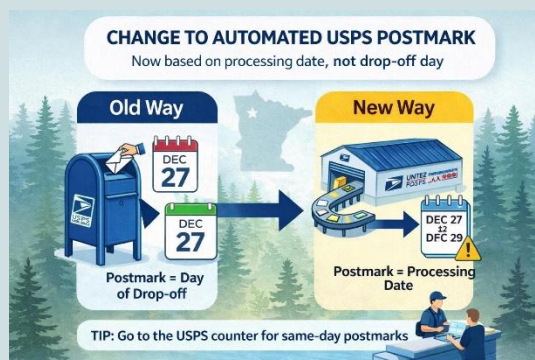
All Town offices and Bentley Memorial Library will be **CLOSED** on Monday, January 19, 2026, in observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE

SUPPLEMENTAL MOTOR VEHICLE TAX BILLS

A small number of Supplemental Motor Vehicle bills were mailed out at the end of December and must be paid by February 2, 2026, to avoid interest. The tax bills are for motor vehicles that were newly registered either in August or September 2025. If you have a vehicle that was registered in that time frame and did not receive a bill, please call my office at 860-649-8066 x6101. Failure to receive a bill does not invalidate the tax and/or interest.



USPS POSTMARK CHANGES

USPS recently changed their procedures in which your mail may not be postmarked the same day it is mailed. Being that this office **must** use a U.S. postmark for interest purposes please make sure if you are mailing your tax bill close to the last day, that you go to the post office to get a hand stamped same day postmark to

make sure that the date of mailing is the date on your envelope.

USING YOUR BANKS BILL PAY

When you use your banks bill pay to make a tax payment, please be aware that the payment is sent by check and mailed using an envelope that is NOT postmarked. If your payment is received after the delinquent date, interest will be added to your account. The guaranteed delivery date from your bank is not the same as a us postmark and will not be used as such. If you pay in this way please mail your payment to Tax Collector, 222 Bolton Center Rd. Bolton CT 06043 and give ample time for the bank to process the check and mail it so it is received before the delinquent date or use another means of payment such as our online payment portal shown below.

When searching for your accounts and look up by name, enter your Last Name, then space, then 1st Initial (example SMITH J) or Business Name (No comma). Do this for every household member to make sure you don't miss any accounts.

"IRS Payment Records for Year 2025."

-Check all account you want to include in your report
and then click "VIEW IRS."

-Left-click on the screen and choose print to print your records.

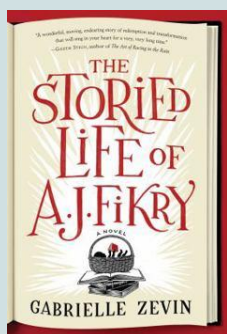

Storytime will continue on Wednesdays in January! Come and enjoy stories and a simple craft. Feel free to bring your own snack or lunch.



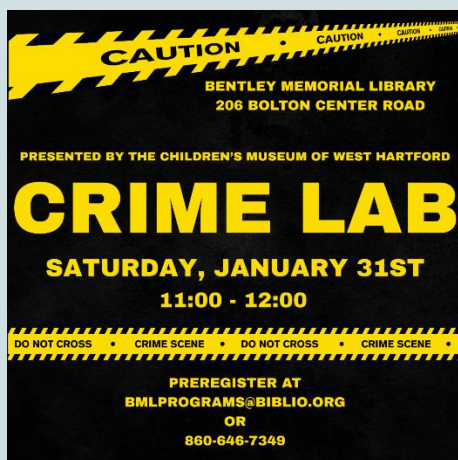
THE STORIED LIFE OF A.J. FIKRY

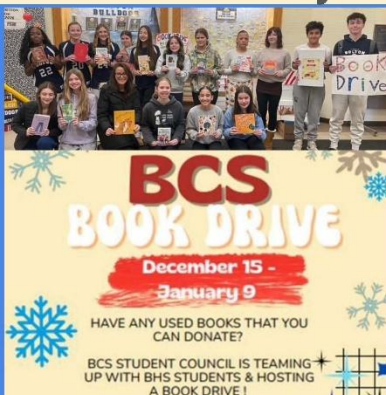

These requirements exist to ensure safety, responsibility, and compliance with state law.

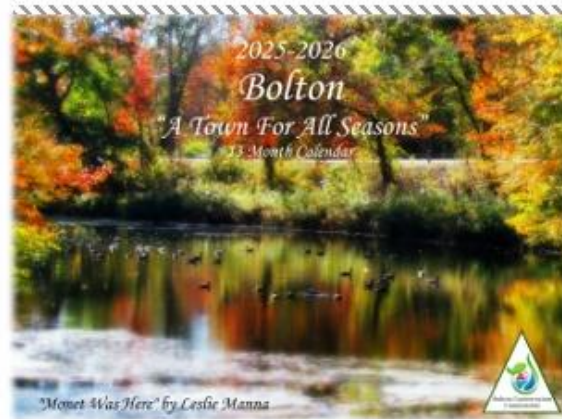
