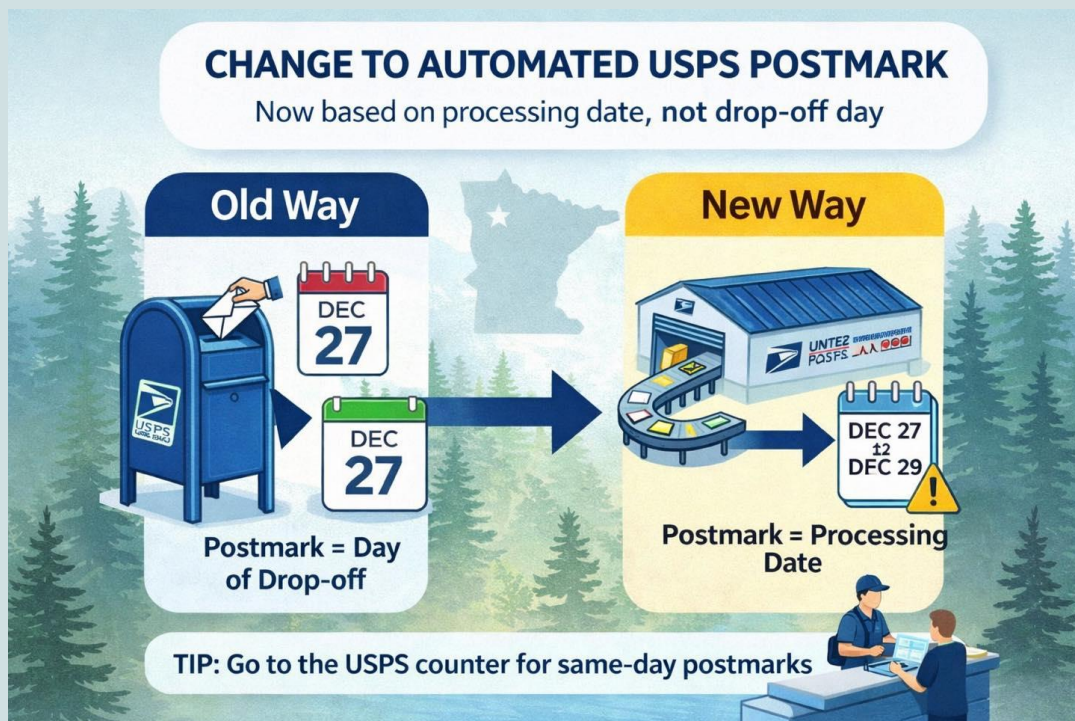
### FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE

#### SUPPLEMENTAL MOTOR VEHICLE TAX BILLS

A small number of Supplemental Motor Vehicle bills were mailed out at the end of December and must be paid by February 2, 2026, to avoid interest. The tax bills are for motor vehicles that were newly registered either in August or September 2025. If you have a vehicle that was registered in that time frame and did not receive a bill, please call my office at 860-649-8066 x6101. Failure to receive a bill does not invalidate the tax and/or interest.

#### USPS POSTMARK CHANGES

USPS recently changed their procedures in which your mail may not be postmarked the same day it is mailed. Being that this office **must** use a U.S. postmark for interest purposes please make sure if you are mailing your tax bill close to the last day, that you go to the post office to get a hand stamped same day postmark to make sure that the date of mailing is the date on your envelope.

### **USING YOUR BANKS BILL PAY**

When you use your banks bill pay to make a tax payment please be aware that the payment is sent by check and mailed using an envelope that is NOT postmarked. If your payment is received after the delinquent date, interest will be added to your account. The guaranteed delivery date from your bank is not the same as a us postmark and will not be used as such. If you pay in this way please mail your payment to Tax Collector, 222 Bolton Center Rd. Bolton CT 06043 and give ample time for the bank to process the check and mail it so it is received before the delinquent date or use another means of payment such as our online payment portal shown below.

### **RECEIPTS OF PAYMENTS MADE IN 2025 FOR IRS**

Please use the link above if you need a receipt of tax payments made in 2025. When searching for your accounts and look up by name, enter your Last Name, then space, then 1st Initial (example SMITH J) or Business Name (No comma). Do this for every household member to make sure you don't miss any accounts.

-Once you put in your name, check the  
"IRS Payment Records for Year 2025."

-Check all account you want to include in your report  
and then click "VIEW IRS."

-Left-click on the screen and choose print to print your records.

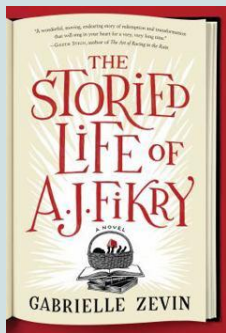

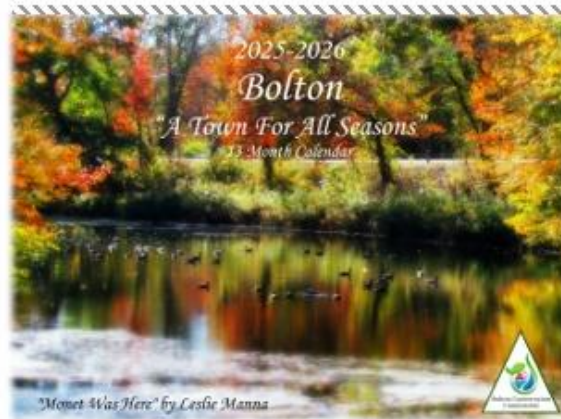

### WINTER TRAILS DAY 2026

Join the Bolton Conservation Commission Saturday, January 10, 2026, at the Heritage Farm beginning at 1:00 PM for WINTER TRAILS DAY.

Hike the trails in the heart of Bolton and explore three of the four Notable Hickory Trees with Notable Tree experts Marty Aligata and John Kehoe.

Connecticut's legendary tree authority Edward A. Richardson (1924–2019) once noted that Heritage Farm is the only site in the state where all four native Hickory species grow together. According to the Connecticut Botanical Society's Notable Tree Survey, Pignut Hickory ranks sixth, Bitternut Hickory also ranks sixth, and Mockernut Hickory ranks eighth among Connecticut's notable specimens.

During this guided walk, participants will search for, identify, and measure the fourth species "Shagbark Hickory" to complete the full set.

Conservation Commission members will also be on hand to identify trees and wildlife tracks (hopefully on snow) along the trail.

The Heritage Farm is located at 266 Bolton Center Rd. Participants should dress for the weather and snow conditions, expect to move slowly on the trail over the moderately rugged landscape. Trail conditions will determine trail routing. No dogs, please. Only heavy rain reschedules the event.
