NOTICE OF REFERENDUM - TOWN OF BOLTON

Pursuant to Section 8.5(3) of the Bolton Town Charter, electors and others qualified to vote at a referendum in the Town of Bolton are hereby warned of a referendum to be held in the aforesaid Town of Bolton at the Parish Center at St. Maurice Church, 32 Hebron Road, Bolton, CT, on **Tuesday**, **July 15**, **2025**, **from 6:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.**

The purpose of this referendum is to vote yes or no on the following question:

"SHALL THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE TOWN OF BOLTON, CONNECTICUT FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2026 AS RECOMMENDED BY THE FINANCE COMMITTEE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$\$26,371,982 BE ADOPTED."

Voting machines will be used. Absentee ballots are available in the Town Clerk's office.

SUMMARY OF CHANGES TO THE PROPOSED FY26 BUDGET

On June 25, 2025, after the third budget referendum failed, the Finance Committee approved:

Reduced Expenses: \$227,000

• **\$110,000 - Capital Budget**. Repair **Highway Plow Truck** for \$10,000 instead of buying a new one. Hope to extend vehicle life for 5 years.

- **\$47,000 Capital Budget.** Do not buy a new **Town Hall Vehicle**. Use existing 14-year-old vehicle until it fails. If needed, share a vehicle with Board of Education.
- \$70,000 Capital Budget. Repair Utility Truck with Plow with \$6,000 in FY25 funds instead of buying a new one. Hope to extend vehicle life for one year.

Increased Unofficial Revenue for FY26: \$285,000

- **\$35,000 Board of Selectmen.** FY25 givebacks from Registrars of Voters after final FY25 referendum.
- **\$250,000 Board of Education.** FY25 givebacks based on updated year-end projections. Retains a cushion for potential year-end food costs.

Proposed FY26 Mil Rates

Real Estate, Personal Property, and Motor Vehicle: 31.96 mil NOTE: The State caps the Motor Vehicle Tax at 32.46 mil.

NEWS FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR

As an update on the town current tax status as of 7-3-25. The 4th budget referendum will be held at the Parish Center at St Maurice Church on July 15^{th.} The mill rate will then be determined (whether actual or temporary) on July 16th and taxes will be available to be paid and will be mailed out shortly after that. Tax bills will need to be paid by September 1st to avoid interest.


