

The Bolton High School Track & Field Team closed out another fantastic season. On May 27th, there were many great results at the NCCC meet at Coventry High School.

Multiple girls and boys qualified for the CIAC S Division Championships at Veterans Stadium in New Britain on June 2nd. The standout results were a second consecutive state championship for the Bolton boys in the 4 x 800 relay. Dominic Lombardo, Nathan Adkins, Shepard Livingston, and Davin Duffy lowered their school record to 8:09.

All four went on to qualify for the State Open Championships in New Britain on June 7th. They also qualified in their individual events. At the State Open, the 4×800 relay team finished 12th overall and lowered the school record again. This time, running 8:03, which is the third fastest S Division time in history.

Then, Nathan finished 9th in the 400 breaking his own school record in 49.54. Davin finished 15th in the 800 in a season best 1:58:02. Shepard finished 12th in the 3200, breaking his own school record in 9:32. Dominic was 19th in the 3200 and since he is a junior, he will be leading BHS in cross-country and track next year. The other three boys closed out amazing careers as some of the best BHS cross-country and track athletes of all time.

Thank you to coaches Matthew Ferraro, Jeremy Peacock, and Paul Smith. They are justifiably proud of the team's accomplishments.
