REMINDER FROM TAX OFFICE

Supplemental Real Estate, Motor Vehicle, and Personal Property taxes are currently due. These bills need to be paid or postmarked by November 3, 2025, to avoid interest.

Real Estate tax bills that are escrowed by your mortgage lender were sent to them for payment. Use the link below for online payments or to check the status of a payment. **ONLINE TAX LOOKUP AND PAY**

If you don't receive a tax bill, please check the link above or call our office for the amount owed. Failure to receive a tax bill does not invalidate the tax and/or interest.

If you plan to use your bank's bill pay, please make sure you allow sufficient time for your bank to process and mail your check so that it is received by the delinquent date. These checks come to us WITHOUT a postmark. Interest will be added if received after November 3rd.

SCRAP METAL October 27- 31, 2025

Curbside scrap metal collection will be held the week of October 27-31, 2025. Items for collection must be curbside by Sunday Night, October 26.

Noncombustible items such as appliances and other metal items weighing up to 100 pounds are acceptable. Gas grill propane tanks need to have the caps removed. Unacceptable items include motor vehicle parts, machinery, and items weighing more than 100 pounds. Please remember this collection is for scrap metal only, not for bulk waste.

Please note that all acceptable scrap metals will be picked up by Friday afternoon. If your items are not picked up by 4 pm on Friday, then you are responsible for getting rid of the items. Any items not picked up can be brought to the transfer station during their scheduled open times. (You will need to purchase a transfer station ticket if this occurs.)

Who CAN VOTE IN THE NOVEMBER ELECTION? US Citizens who are registered can participate in voting. Note: Former Bolton residents who are US Citizens should contact the Town Clerk's office to determine eligibility.

Important Registration Dates:

Voter Registration for Early Voting: Same Day Registration (SDR) is available at the Early Voting location during the early voting period (October 20th-November 2nd)

November 3, 2025: Deadline for admitting those seeking to vote in the Election whose qualification as to age, citizenship, or residence was attained on or after October 17th. Registrar of Voter's office will be open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

November 4, 2025: Same Day Registration/Voting available at ROV's office 6 a.m.-8 p.m.
