BUSINESS OF THE MONTH ROCKLAND FARM



The Town of Bolton is proud to name Rockland Farm as October's Business of the Month. What began nearly a century ago as a modest milk-delivery operation has grown into a vibrant local hub offering fresh products, community connections, and a lasting family legacy.

Rockland Farm has been part of Bolton for over 90 years. In the 1930s, Leonard L. and Alice Giglio cleared the land on South Road, milked cows, and delivered milk door-to-door. In the late 1960s, their son Leonard M. and his wife Karen expanded to bulk milk production, raising their two sons on the farm and serving the community until Leonard M.'s passing in 2017.

After the dairy closed in 2019, Leonard W. (Lenny) and his wife, Cheryl sought new ways to preserve the farm. They continued their long-running hay business and, in 2022, brought cows back to the barn to raise and sell locally grown beef. In 2024, they opened the Rockland Farm Shop, offering USDA-inspected beef and chicken raised on their farm, fresh chicken eggs, beef tallow, organic herbs, and other farm products directly to the community.



This October marks the one-year anniversary of the farm shop. Join Rockland Farm October 4–5 for a weekend of farm tours, goat feedings, product discounts, giveaways, and a sneak peek at holiday gift ideas. The farm welcomes visitors during shop hours—Tuesday, Thursday, Friday 4–7 PM; Saturday and Sunday 9 AM–3 PM—to meet the animals and enjoy the scenic grounds.

FROM THE TAX COLLECTOR'S OFFICE

Property Tax Bills

Tax Bills were mailed out by the end of September for the Motor Vehicle, Personal Property and remaining balance due for Real Estate accounts AND are available to be viewed and paid online. These bills will be due October 1, 2025, and must be paid by or postmarked by November 3, 2025, to avoid interest. Interest accrues at 1.5% from the due date of October 1st, for a total of 18% per year. Please be aware that if paid late the interest rate is 3% for November 4-30th. Minimum interest is \$2.00 per bill.

What if I do not receive a tax bill?

Not receiving a tax bill does not invalidate the tax and/or interest. If you do not receive a tax bill you can check online and print it out with the above link and/or call our office.

Motor Vehicle Accounts: Please make sure to check your car registration to make sure it is still active, which could be the reason why you did not receive a tax bill. If there is a lapse in your registration, please call the Assessor's office. They can add it on to the tax rolls once your registration has been renewed to avoid multiple tax bills being due at a later point.

Real Estate Accounts: If you escrow your taxes to be paid by your mortgage lender your tax bill will be sent to them for payment.

If you recently paid off your mortgage, switched mortgage companies or now pay your own taxes, and you did not receive your tax bill please either use the link above to find your account or call our office to get a copy of your tax bill.

If you receive a bill that your mortgage holder is supposed to pay, please call and forward the bill to the mortgage holder so they have time to process and send the payment.

PAYMENT OPTIONS AND INFORMATION

FROM THE ASSESSOR'S OFFICE

DECLARING PERSONAL PROPERTY: All persons liable to pay taxes are notified to declare all tangible personal property owned by them on October 1, 2025. Non-residents are required to declare property located in Bolton for any three months prior to 10/1/2025. Declarations are mailed to all property owners on record. Failure to receive a form does not negate the requirement to declare. Failure to declare by November 3, 2025 will result in a 25% PENALTY assessment. Extension requests are due by 11/3/2025. All declaration forms are in the Assessor's Office and online at www.boltonct.gov.

Taxable personal property includes: unregistered motor vehicles (e.g. motor homes, campers, travel trailers, passenger cars, commercial use trailers, etc.), motor vehicles located in Connecticut but registered in another state, horses & ponies, mobile manufactured homes not assessed as real estate, manufacturing machinery & equipment, business furniture & fixtures, farm machinery, farming tools, mechanics tools, electronic data processing equipment, telecommunications equipment, cables, conduits, pipes, poles, business expensed supplies and other property such as construction equipment, billboards, vending machines, leasehold improvements, etc. Real property and Connecticut registered motor vehicles do not need to be declared.

<u>VETERANS</u> who served for ninety days or more during a time of war or have been disabled must record their honorable discharge with the Town Clerk by September 30, 2025 to receive a minimum 3,000 assessment exemption. Disabled Veterans need to file proof of their VA rating with the Assessor to receive an increased exemption. 100% Permanently & Totally Disabled Veterans need to file proof of their VA rating with the Assessor to receive the property tax exemption under P.A. 24-26 & 25-168.

ADDITIONAL VETERANS' EXEMPTION: Increased exemptions are available for Veterans who meet income requirements. An application along with proof of calendar year 2024 income must be filed with the Assessor biennially, no later than October 1, 2025. GL 2025 income limits are \$45,200 (single) & \$55,100 (married).

<u>ARMED SERVICE MEMBERS</u> may obtain an exemption on one passenger motor vehicle by filing an application annually.

TOTALLY DISABLED: Any person under the age of 65 eligible to receive permanent total disability payments from Social Security or another government program, must apply by January 30, 2026 to receive a 1,000 assessment exemption. Applicants must furnish proof of disability award.

FARM MACHINERY & EQUIPMENT: Eligible farmers must file the notarized exemption application no later than November 3, 2025.

MANUFACTURING MACHINERY AND EQUIPMENT installed in a manufacturing facility and used in the manufacturing process may be exempt. Eligible manufacturers must complete and file the MME Exemption Application by November 3, 2025.

NEW COMMERCIAL TRUCKS with a gross vehicle rating over 26,000 lbs. should check with the Assessors' Office for tax exemption eligibility. Applications must be completed and filed with the Assessor by November 3, 2025.

LAND CLASSIFICATION: Persons seeking to classify land under Farm or Forest for the first time, or to amend an original filing for changes in ownership, use or acreage must file between September 2, 2025 & October 31, 2025. Applications for Forest Land classification require a PA490 Certified State Forester's Report dated by October 1, 2025.







SCRAP METAL October 27- 31, 2025


Curbside scrap metal collection will be held the week of October 27- 31, 2025. Items for collection **must be curbside by Sunday Night, October 26.**

Noncombustible items such as appliances and other metal items weighing up to 100 pounds are acceptable. Gas grill propane tanks need to have the caps removed. Unacceptable items include motor vehicle parts, machinery, and items weighing more than 100 pounds. Please remember this collection is for scrap metal only, not for bulk waste.

Please note that all acceptable scrap metals will be picked up by Friday afternoon. If your items are not picked up by 4 pm on Friday, then you are responsible for getting rid of the items. Any items not picked up can be brought to the transfer station during their scheduled open times. (You will need to purchase a transfer station ticket if this occurs.)
