### **Knox Box Safety Program**

A Knox Box provides local first responders with quick and safe entry to a home during an emergency without property damage. The device is fastened to a door and does not require permanent adhesion. It is available for both homeowners and renters. The Knox Boxes were purchased by Bolton Senior Inc. with grant funding from the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving Bolton Community Fund. Relay Connecticut is a 24-hour service that enables individuals who are deaf, hard of hearing, DeafBlind or have difficulty speaking to communicate freely with friends, family and businesses. For people who have difficulty hearing or speaking, the simple act of using a telephone can be a challenging and frustrating experience. Whether it's conducting business, speaking to doctors, making appointments or just keeping in touch with family and friends, an inability to communicate over the phone can affect almost every aspect of a person's dayto-day life. Multiple service options are available to fit individual communication needs.
