22-158 An Ordinance Further Amending the Zoning Ordinances of the City of Revere Relative to Research and Development Facilities.

Council President Visconti offered the following amendments to the proposed ordinance.

Section 1. shall be amended by including the following language: "Animal testing shall be prohibited in research and development facilities in the following zoning districts in which the use is allowed by special permit: PDD1, PDD2, HB, TED, and IP."

Section 3. shall be amended by including the following language: "Animal testing on the following species shall not be permitted in the Suffolk Downs Overlay District: cats, dogs, rabbits, monkeys, chimpanzees, and other related primates."

Section 4. shall be amended by including the following use table:

17 <u>22-158</u> An Ordinance Further Amending the Zoning Ordinances of the City of Revere Relative to Research and Development Facilities

An Ordinance Further Amending the Zoning Ordinances of the City of Revere Relative to the Regulation of Research and Development Facilities

Be it ordained by the City of Revere as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 17.08.652 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended by deleting the definition of Research and Development Facilities and inserting in place thereof the following new definition:

"Research and development facilities" means facilities including research and testing laboratories and including manufacturing associated with research and development facilities. Laboratories engaged in research, experimental and testing activities, may include, but are not limited to, the development of mock-ups and prototypes; biomedical facilities defined by the National Institute of Health as Biolevel-1 (BL-1) or Biolevel-2 (BL-2) facilities subject to applicable state and federal laws and regulations. Animal testing shall be prohibited in research and development facilities in the following zoning districts in which the use is allowed by special permit: PDD1, PDD2, HB, TED, and IP. Biomedical facilities defined by the National Institute of Health as Biolevel-3 (BL-3) or Biolevel-4 (BL-4) facilities shall not be permitted in the City of Revere.

Section 2. Section 17.26.030 - Prohibited Uses in the Suffolk Downs Overlay District of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended by inserting new sub-section JJ.

"JJ. Research and development facilities including life sciences manufacturing and biomedical facilities defined by the National Institute of Health as Biolevel-3 (BL-3) or Biolevel-4 (BL-4) facilities.

- 1. The final building design and exterior materials shall be approved by the Site Plan Review Committee.
- 2. Screening measures shall be incorporated along all sides of the parking lot area which borders adjacent residential uses.
- 3. The plans shall be reviewed and approved by the Conservation Commission.
- 4. A final Site Plan Review report shall be issued by the Site Plan Review Committee prior to the issuance of any building permit.
- 5. A landscaping plan shall be approved by the Site Plan Review Committee for streetscape improvements and landscaped areas within the site.
- 6. The City Engineer and DPW Chief of Infrastructure shall review and approve utility plans for the proposed sewer service, water service and stormwater management plan.
- 7. Hydrant flow tests shall be conducted on Revere Beach Boulevard to determine the adequacy of both domestic and fire flow and for the proper sizing of domestic and fire flow service to the building.
- 8. A sewer and water connection permit must be obtained from the DPW. In accordance with the current DEP Administrative Order and EPA Consent Decree, a sewer connection fee shall be paid to the City of Revere for 10/1 removal of inflow and infiltration (I/I) from the sanitary sewer system. The formula for the sewer connection fee is based on 110 gallons/bedroom x 10 x \$1.30/gallon. Since the proposed development shall provide for 8 additional bedrooms, the I/I fee shall be \$11,440.
- 9. In accordance with Chapter 17.47, the Community Improvement Trust Fund is applicable to this development project. Under the Community Improvement Trust Fund, the developer is required to contribute 3% of the construction cost of construction above and beyond what is allowed as of right towards the fund, which must be used exclusively towards capital improvement projects

within the impacted area. For the purpose of this special permit, 3% of the construction cost shall be based on the increased density of 8 additional units to a nonconforming structure.




