Legislative Affairs Sub-Committee Report

The Legislative Affairs Sub-Committee met on Monday evening, June 14, 2021 at 5:00PM in the City Councillor Joseph A. DelGrosso, City Council Chamber, Revere City Hall. Committee members present were Councillors Keefe, Novoselsky, Visconti, Zambuto, and Chairman Morabito. Councillor Powers was absent.

The following matters were on the committee's agenda up for discussion:

20-370 An Ordinance Relative to Transient Vendors.

Transient Vendors and Door-to-Door have been broken out into their own Chapters, 5.13 Transient Vendors and 5.12 Door-to-Door respectively. The rules and regulations for Transient Vendors are completely new and the license fee was reduced from \$2,000 to \$500. There are no changes in the rules and regulations for Door-to-Door Solicitors - only the section numbers have been changed. The committee unanimously provided a favorable recommendation to the City Council to approve this ordinance.

21-060 An Ordinance Relative to Baiting Procedures for Rodent Control.

The committee discussed an appropriate period time to bait prior, during, and after discussion. The committee determined that the time prior to construction shall be amended to provide for twenty-eight days. Twenty-one days after construction was deemed sufficient by the committee. The proposed ordinance, as amended, received a favorable recommendation and will be reported out to the City Council this evening for consideration.

Motion presented by Councillor Rotondo: That the City council request the State Delegation to amend the Open Meeting Law through legislation in which translation of multiple foreign languages are used in the notification process on all spectrums of medium used to comply with the current legislation.

Councillor Rotondo was not able to attend the Legislative Affairs Sub-Committee so his request will remain in committee.

7 <u>20-370</u> An Ordinance Further Amending the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere Relative to Transient Vendors, Door-to-Solicitors, and Canvassers.

Be it ordained by the City of Revere, MA as follows:

AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF REVERE RELATIVE TO TRANSIENT VENDOR LICENSES, DOOR-TO-SOLICITORS, AND CANVASSERS

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 5.12 Transient Vendors is hereby deleted in its entirety and inserted in place thereof the following new Chapter 5.13 Transient Vendors

Section 5.13.010 Definitions.

As used in this article, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section:

- A. Transient vendor means any person who engages in a "temporary or transient business" selling goods, wares or merchandise, either in one locality or in traveling from place to place.
- B. Temporary or transient business means any exhibition and sale of goods, wares or merchandise which is carried on in any tent, booth, building or other structure, unless such place is open for business during usual business hours for a period of at least 12 consecutive months.

Section 5.13.020 Transient vendor licenses.

- A. Every transient vendor, before making any sale of goods, wares or merchandise in the city, shall apply to the city council for a license and shall accompany such application with a license fee of five hundred dollars as listed in Table I Fee Schedule. Such application shall be filed with the city clerk.
- B. No license shall be granted under this section until the applicant has complied with the provisions of Chapter 101, Section 3 of the General Laws and has exhibited to the city clerk a license issued by the director of standards of the commonwealth.
- C. If, after review of said application, it appears that the applicant is a person of good repute as to morals and integrity and he or she is a person of responsibility and business acumen, the city council may authorize the city clerk to issue a city license to the applicant. Upon order of the city council and proof of payment of all license fees the city clerk shall issue the city license endorsed upon the state license "local license fees paid" and shall affix thereto his or her official signature

and date of such endorsement.

Section 5.13.030 Expiration of license.

The city transient vendor license shall remain in force so long as the licensee shall continuously keep and expose for sale such stock of goods, wares and merchandise but not later than the first day of January following its date.

Section 5.13.040 Licenses for nonprofit organizations.

The city council may, under such conditions as they may deem proper, grant to any organization engaged in charitable work or to a post of any incorporated organization of veterans who served in the military or naval service of the United States in time of war or insurrection a special license authorizing it, for a particular time period to be stated in such license, and for a charitable purpose stated in such license, to conduct under their control a temporary or transient business, provided that no person under 16 years of age shall be accredited as an agent of the license holder. The exercise of the license hereby provided for shall be subject to the provisions of all statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations not inconsistent herewith.

Section 5.13.050 Display of license.

Every transient vendor shall exhibit his or her state and city licenses when the same are demanded of him or her by a councillor or sealer or deputy sealer of weights and measures or member of the police department of the city.

Section 5.13.060 Additional city permits.

Should a license be issued pursuant to this article, the licensee shall be responsible for obtaining and maintaining any and all other relevant licenses, permits and seals, including, but not limited to, health department and fire department permits, and seals from the sealer of weights and measures.

Section 5.12.070 Revocation of license.

Any transient vendor license granted by the city council may be revoked by the city council for good cause after reasonable notice to the licensee and a hearing upon the grounds for revocation.

Section 5.13.070 Bond or insurance required.

No transient vendor shall sell goods, wares or merchandise in the city unless such transient vendor has posted a bond with, or has provided a certificate of liability insurance naming the city as an "additional insured" to, the city clerk in the amount of five thousand dollars, and has signed an agreement providing for indemnification of the city against any loss which may arise by way of any suit, action or proceeding against the city as a result of any act or failure to act on the part of such transient vendor while operating within the territorial limits of the city. This indemnification agreement shall be

in a form approved by the city solicitor.

Section 5.13.080 Minimum age.

No person under 18 years of age shall receive a license as a transient vendor.

Section 5.13.090 Additional restrictions.

The terms of every transient vendor license issued pursuant to this article shall be subject to such further restrictions and regulations as the city council shall impose.

Section 5.13.100 Penalties.

Any transient vendor who violates any provision of this chapter shall be punishable in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 1.16 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere by a fine of three hundred (\$300.00) dollars, or be subject to arrest as provided for by Chapter 101, Section 32 of the General Laws.

Section 5.13.110 Conflict with state license.

Nothing in this article shall be construed as conflicting with any license duly issued under the laws of the commonwealth.

<u>Section 2.</u> Title 5 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended by inserting a new Chapter 5.12 Door-to-door Solicitors and Canvassers:

Chapter 5.12 Door-to-door solicitors and canvassers. Section 5.12.010 Definitions.

The terms "soliciting" and "canvassing" means and includes any one or more of the following activities:

- A. Seeking to obtain the purchase, or the orders for the purchase, of goods, wares, merchandise, foodstuffs, services, of any kind of consideration whatever; or
- B. Seeking to obtain subscriptions to books, magazines, periodicals, newspapers, and every other type or kind of publication; or
- C. Seeking to obtain gifts or contributions of money, clothing or any other valuable thing for the support or benefit of, or seeking to gain membership in or volunteers for, any charitable or nonprofit association, organization, corporation or project.

The provisions of Sections 5.12.010 through 5.12.080 shall not apply to those who are operating validly as hawkers or peddlers or open air vendors, or to officers or employees of the city, county, state or federal government, or any subdivision thereof, when on official business, or to the city of Revere neighborhood youth and students who solicit for the shoveling of snow or cutting of lawns, or in connection with fundraising activities or city of Revere senior citizen fundraising activities, or to milkpersons, bakery persons, insurance agents, laundry persons, and ice, oil and coal dealers, nor shall it be construed to prevent route salespersons or other persons having established customers to whom they make periodic deliveries from calling upon such customers.

Minutes Acceptance: Minutes of Jun 14, 2021 6:00 PM (Salute to the Flag)

If any solicitor or canvasser is under the age of eighteen years and is selling goods or periodicals for a commercial purpose, the provisions of M.G.L. Chapter 101, Section 34 shall apply.

5.12.020 Registration required.

It is unlawful for any person to solicit or canvass, for him or herself or for another person, or organization, by foot, automobile or any other type of conveyance, from place to place, house to house or street to street, calling at residences without the previous consent of the occupant, without first having registered with the chief of police.

5.12.030 Application for certificate of registration.

- A. Application for a certificate of registration shall be made upon a form provided by the police department.
- B. An authorized representative of the sponsoring organization shall apply to the chief of police of his designee either personally, between the hours of nine a.m. and two p.m. from Monday through Thursday excluding holidays, or by mail, and truthfully state in full the information requested on the application, to wit:
 - 1. Name, address and telephone number of the sponsoring organization;
 - 2. State and/or federal tax identification number or tax exempt number of the sponsoring organization;
 - 3. Name, residential address, telephone number, social security number and date of birth of each representative of sponsoring organization who will be soliciting or canvassing in the city;
 - 4. Period of time for which the certificate is applied (i.e., the dates on which the soliciting or canvassing will take place);
 - 5. Any convictions for a violation of a felony or crimes against the person under the laws of the commonwealth or any other state or federal law of the United States within five years of the application, by the sponsoring organization or any of its representatives who will be soliciting or canvassing in the city;
 - 6. Signature of authorized representative of the sponsoring organization.
- C. A photograph or an acceptable copy of a photograph of each representative of the sponsoring organization who will be soliciting or canvassing in the city must be attached to the application.
- D. If the sponsoring organization is required by M.G.L.A. Chapter 68, Section 19, to register as a charitable organization with the commonwealth, a copy of said registration must be attached to the application.
- E. All statements made by the application upon the application or in connection therewith shall be under oath.
- F. No certificate of registration shall be issued to any person who has been

convicted of the commission of a felony or crime against the person within five years of the date of the application; nor to any person whose certificate of registration issued hereunder has previously been revoked as provided herein.

- G. The chief of police shall cause to be kept in his office an accurate record of every application received and acted upon together with all other information and date pertaining thereto and all certificates of registration issued under the provisions of Sections 5.12.010 through 5.12.080 and of denial of applications. Fully completed applications for certificates, shall be acted upon within three days of receipt. The original copy of the application shall be given to the applicant and a duplicate copy shall be retained on file in the office of the chief of police.
- H. When approved, each solicitor or canvasser shall be issued a certificate of registration and shall at all times while soliciting or canvassing in the city carry upon his/her person the registration certificate and the same shall be exhibited by such registrant whenever he or she is required to do so by any police officer or by any person solicited. The certificate of registration shall state the expiration date thereof.
- I. An administration fee of ten dollars shall be charged for each certificate of registration issued.
- J. Soliciting and canvassing may be conducted Monday through Saturday between the hours of nine a.m. and eight p.m., and Sundays between the hours of twelve p.m. and six p.m., excluding major holidays on which retail stores and businesses (except for local convenience stores, restaurants and other food establishments) are closed.

5.12.040 Deceptive practices.

No solicitor or canvasser may use any plan, scheme or ruse which misrepresents the true status or mission of the person making the call in order to gain admission to a person's home, office or other establishment.

5.12.050 - Duty of solicitors and canvassers.

It shall be the duty of every solicitor and canvasser going onto any premises in the city to first examine whether there is a notice stating that no solicitors are welcome; if such notice is present then the solicitor or canvasser shall immediately and peacefully depart from the premises.

Any solicitor or canvasser who has gained entrance to any residence, whether invited or not, shall immediately and peacefully depart from the premises when requested to do so by the occupant

5.12.060 - Revocation of certificate.

Any certificate of registration issued hereunder shall be revoked by the chief of police

if the holder of the certificate is convicted of a violation of any of the provisions of Sections_5.12.010 through 5.12.080 or has made a false material statement in the application or otherwise becomes disqualified for the issuance of a certificate of registration under the terms of said sections. Immediately upon such revocation, written notice thereof shall be given by the chief of police to the holder of the certificate in person or by certified United States mail addressed to his or her residence or organization address set forth in the application.

Immediately upon the giving of such notice the certificate of registration shall become void.

5.12.070 - Solicitation of donations upon the public ways.*

No person, individually or on behalf of any organization, shall at any time, solicit donations of any kind from any operator or occupant of a motor vehicle upon the public way.

5.12.080 - Penalty for violations.

Any violation of the provisions of this title shall be punishable in accordance with the provisions of Title 1, Chapter 1.16 of the Revised Ordinances of the city of Revere by a fine of three hundred dollars.

<u>Section 3.</u> Table I - Fee Schedule of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended deleting the words, "Section 5.12.020 of this revision, is two thousand dollars" and inserting in place thereof, "Chapter 5.13.020, is five hundred dollars".

8 <u>21-060</u> An Ordinance Further Amending the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere Relative to Baiting Procedures for Rodent Control.

Be it ordained by the City of Revere, MA as follows:

AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING THE REVISED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF REVERE RELATIVE TO RODENT CONTROL

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 8.04.080 Rodent Control of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended by deleting Sub-Section C in its entirety and inserting in place thereof the following new Sub-Section C:

- C. Any agreement made between the city of Revere and any contractor shall include provisions for baiting under the following schedule:
 - i. Twenty-eight days before the start of, through the duration of, and twenty-one days after the completion of, or at the discretion of the health agent, any construction, renovation, development, demolition or conversion projects of buildings. Failure to do so will be punishable by a fine of two hundred fifty dollars per day, per contractor.
 - ii. Twenty-eight days before the start of, through the duration of, and twenty-one days after the completion of, or at the discretion of the health agent, any project which requires the opening of public roadways by the City of Revere or its agents, including, but not limited to, public works projects, infrastructure projects and utility projects. Failure to do so will be punishable by a fine of two hundred fifty dollars per day, per contractor.
 - iii. Bait traps shall be placed and spaced at an appropriate distance according to industry standards for all projects requiring them in accordance with this section.

The Zoning Sub-Committee provided a unanimous favorable recommendation to the City Council. The applicant stated that the outdoor patio space is ADA compliant and will help provide extra space for his customers especially those who are concerned with Covid transmission.

21-170 Rod Rivera, 97 Beach St., Malden, MA 02148 seeking permission from the Revere City Council to alter and extend the existing non-conforming office use to a non-conforming fast food/take-out use to enable the appellant to operate an ice cream and smoothie shop at 54 Yeamans Street, Revere, MA 02151.

Chairman Keefe indicated that he received feedback from area residents regarding the proposed use. A fast food/take-out is not an allowable use within the RB District and would be substantially more detrimental than the prior non-conforming office use due to the increase in foot and vehicular traffic.

The applicants addressed the committee and are known to run two other successful businesses in the City and further stated they receive a lot of business through food delivery services such as Uber Eats or Grub Hub. The committee finds that this would only add to the vehicular traffic already present on Yeamans Street. This type of use would be better suited in a commercial area such as Broadway, Squire Road, or commercial areas located near residential areas, but not solely within a residential area.

In accordance with Section 17.40.020 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere states that the City Council may only award a special permit if it determines that such a change shall not be substantially more detrimental that the existing nonconforming use to the neighborhood. The Zoning Sub-Committee finds that a fast-food/take-out use is substantially more detrimental than the prior non-conforming office use and therefore cannot recommend to the City Council to award a special permit for a proposed ice cream and smoothie shop.

The Zoning Sub-Committee provided a unanimous recommendation to deny the applicant's' request.

I. AN ORDINANCE FURTHER AMENDING TITLE 2 OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF REVERE

SECTION 1. Title 2 of the Revised Ordinances of the city of Revere is hereby amended by inserting the following new chapter and sections:

Chapter 2.90 – Affordable Housing Trust Fund; Board

2.90.010 – Board of Trustees: established; appointment; term; filling of vacancies; removal.

The city of Revere shall establish an Affordable Housing Trust Fund Board of Trustees consisting of nine members appointed by the Mayor, and who shall serve without compensation. The Mayor shall ensure, to the extent feasible, that the composition of the board reflects the geographic and ethnic mix that exists in the city. All board members should have some working interest in the City. Members shall be appointed as follows:

- (1) The Mayor, or a designee, who shall serve as chair;
- (2) A. There shall be at all times appointed to the board at least one individual with financial/lending experience.
 - B. At least one individual with experience in housing development, which may include, but is not limited to:
 - a. Non-profit affordable housing development.
 - b. Real estate or finance, especially with regard to affordable housing development.
 - c. Non-profit housing services.
 - C. At least two individuals referred to the Mayor by a community organization conducting supportive housing or other anti-poverty work in the City of Revere. The Mayor ought to solicit nominations from these community organizations for the purposes of filling these board positions.
 - D. At least two individuals who are tenants in the City of Revere. One member must live in an affordable housing property, and the other must live in a market-rate unit.
 - E. One board membership shall be reserved for the City Council president or their designee. The Mayor must approve this nomination.

- (3) A minimum of five of the nine trustees shall be Revere residents.
- (4) All members, excluding the Mayor or his/her designee, are subject to confirmation by the City Council.
- (5) Trustees shall be appointed for a two-year term.
- (6) Members shall be eligible for reappointment in the same manner as the original appointment. If a vacancy occurs, it shall be filled for the balance of the unexpired term in the same manner as the initial appointment was made.
- (7) Trustees may be removed by the Mayor.

2.90.020 - Powers and duties.

The trustees shall administer an Affordable Housing Trust Fund to provide for the creation and preservation of affordable housing within the city of Revere for the benefit of low- to moderate-income households, as defined by income limits published from time to time by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and to pursue other strategies to support the City's affordable housing goals.

The specific powers and duties of the trustees, all of which shall be carried on in furtherance of the purposes set forth in this ordinance, are as follows:

- (1) To accept and receive real property, personal property or money, by gift, grant, contribution, devise or transfer from any person, firm, corporation or other public or private entity, including without limitation grants of funds or other property tendered to the trust in connection with provisions of any zoning ordinance or bylaw or any other ordinance or bylaw;
- (2) To purchase and retain real or personal property, including without restriction investments that yield a high rate of income or no income;
- (3) To sell, lease, exchange, transfer or convey any personal, mixed, or real property at public auction or by private contract for such consideration and on such terms as to credit or otherwise, and to make such contracts and enter into such undertaking relative to trust property as the board deems advisable notwithstanding the length of any such lease or contract;
- (4) To execute, acknowledge and deliver deeds, assignments, transfers, pledges, leases, covenants, contracts, promissory notes, releases, grant agreements and other instruments sealed or unsealed, necessary, proper or incident to any transaction in which the board engages for the accomplishment of the purposes of the trust;

- (5) To employ advisors and agents, such as accountants, appraisers and lawyers as the board deems necessary;
- (6) To pay reasonable compensation and expenses to all advisors and agents and to apportion such compensation between income and principal as the board deems advisable;
- (7) To apportion receipts and charges between incomes and principal as the board deems advisable, to amortize premiums and establish sinking funds for such purpose, and to create reserves for depreciation depletion or otherwise;
- (8) To participate in any reorganization, recapitalization, merger or similar transactions; and to give proxies or powers of attorney with or without power of substitution to vote any securities or certificates of interest; and to consent to any contract, lease, mortgage, purchase or sale of property, by or between any corporation and any other corporation or person;
- (9) To deposit any security with any protective reorganization committee, and to delegate to such committee such powers and authority with relation thereto as the board may deem proper and to pay, out of trust property, such portion of expenses and compensation of such committee as the board may deem necessary and appropriate;
- (10) To carry property for accounting purposes other than acquisition date values;
- (11) To borrow money on such terms and conditions and from such sources as the board deems advisable, to mortgage and pledge trust assets as collateral;
- (12) To make distributions or divisions of principal in kind;
- (13) To comprise, attribute, defend, enforce, release, settle or otherwise adjust claims in favor or against the trust, including claims for taxes, and to accept any property, either in total or partial satisfaction of any indebtedness or other obligation, and subject to the provisions of this act, to continue to hold the same for such period of time as the board may deem appropriate;
- (14) To manage or improve real property; and to abandon any property which the board determines not to be worth retaining;
- (15) To hold all or part of the trust property uninvested for such purposes and for such time as the board may deem appropriate; and
- (16) To extend the time for payment of any obligation to the trust.

The powers and duties enumerated above are intended to encompass all powers and duties of the trustees. Any action, power or duty not enumerated above shall require prior approval of the city council.

2.90.030 – Records; annual report.

The trustees shall keep a record of its doings and at the close of every fiscal year make a report thereof to the City Council. The report shall include a description and source of funds received and expended and the type of affordable housing programs or properties assisted with the funding. The trustees shall also provide the city council with a copy of the trust's annual audit.

2.90.040 - Affordable housing trust fund.

There is hereby created, pursuant to M.G.L. c. 44, § 55C, an affordable housing trust fund. The city treasurer shall be the custodian of such fund. The fund shall be utilized to provide for the creation and preservation of affordable housing in Revere for the benefit of low and moderate-income households and for the funding of community housing.

2.90.050 – Transfers to the affordable housing trust fund.

Within ninety days of the certification of free cash by the department of revenue, the mayor shall present to the city council, and the city council shall approve, a transfer to the affordable housing trust fund of a sum equal to but not less than ten percent of the total free cash amount certified by the department of revenue.

An Ordinance Establishing Rules and Regulations Relative to the West Revere Dog Park

<u>Section 1.</u> Chapter 6.01 Regulation of Dogs of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Revere is hereby amended by inserting the following new section:

6.01.170 – West Revere Dog Park (a/k/a Paws N Play Dog Park)

Whereas, the provisions of this section are intended to be rules and regulations for maintaining order at the West Revere Dog Park (a/k/a Paws N Play Dog Park) on Sargent Street:

A. Rules and Regulations

- i. Dogs must be licensed, vaccinated, healthy, and free of any contagious diseases.
- ii. Dogs must wear a collar displaying license at all times; no prong, spike or choke collars shall be permitted.
- iii. There is a maximum of two dogs per handler allowed in the dog park, and no doggie daycare or similar pet sitting personnel shall be permitted to utilize the park with clients' dogs when the number of dogs exceeds two per handler.
- iv. Dogs shall remain on their leash until inside the gated area of the park.
- v. Digging shall not be permitted; handler shall fill in any holes made by dog(s) under their control.
- vi. All dogs shall be within sight and voice control of handler at all times.
- vii. Aggressive, sick dogs and puppies under four months are prohibited.
- viii. If a dog displays any aggressive, rough, or unruly behavior or mounting, the handler shall immediately leash and remove problem dog(s) from the park. Handler(s) shall remove dog(s) at the first sign of aggression.
- ix. No food or treats are permitted inside the park.
- x. No person in the park shall behave in any manner that antagonizes a dog or violates animal cruelty laws.
- xi. Leaving dogs unattended is prohibited, and unattended dogs shall be impounded.
- xii. All handlers are required to immediately pick up after their dog(s) and dispose of waste in appropriate receptacles.
- xiii. Handlers must be over 18 years old and are legally responsible their dogs and any injuries or damages caused by dog(s) in the park. The City of Revere shall not be liable for any injury or damage caused by any dog or handler in the park.
- xiv. Any dog that exhibits a history of aggressive behavior may have park privileges revoked by the police chief or his or her designee, including the animal control officer.
- xv. No smoking, food, glass containers or alcoholic beverages shall be permitted in the park.
- xvi. No rollerblading, skateboarding, or bicycles are permitted in the park.
- xvii. The gates to the park shall be closed at all times.

B. Enforcement

The police chief, or his or her designee, including the animal control officer, and any Revere police officer shall have authority to enforce the provisions set forth in Section 6.01.170 of the Ordinances of the City of Revere. Any alleged violation of this title may be made the subject matter of noncriminal disposition proceedings commenced by such agent in accordance with M.G.L. c. 40, § 21D.

C. Penalties

- i. First offense in any calendar year: twenty-five dollars.
- ii. Second offense in any calendar year: fifty dollars.
- iii. Third and subsequent offense in any calendar year: one-hundred dollars.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR URBAN AGRICULTURE, ACCESORY USE RESIDENTIAL FARMS, AND COMMUNITY GARDENS, FARMS, AND FARMNG ON MUNICIPAL PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, the City of Revere is committed to increasing access to fresh, locally grown, wholesome foods for all residents; and.

WHEREAS, as national leaders in innovative government practice, Revere on the Move and its local partners have established a wide and increasing variety of programs and resources for access to fresh food; and.

WHEREAS, state and national policies are encouraging home gardeners to produce their own food; and,

WHEREAS, there is local interest in additional community gardens, community farms, and small commercial farms; and,

WHEREAS, growing local foods eliminates both the need for fossil fuels in transporting food and the use of destructive chemicals that are part of large-scale food production operations; and,

WHEREAS, urban agriculture at a residential scale provides a valuable supplement to a family food budget; and,

WHEREAS, urban agriculture at a residential scale provides an invaluable opportunity for students to learn about nutrition and where food comes from; and,

WHEREAS, new technologies for growing food, including indoor growing technologies such as aquaponics and hydroponics are the basis for new agricultural opportunities, partnerships and research; now,

Now therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Revere as follows:

Chapter 17.16 Use Regulations is hereby amended by inserting a new section as follows:

Section 17.16.470 Urban Agriculture

A. Definitions:

- 1. <u>Agriculture, Urban (Urban Agriculture)</u>: An umbrella term that describes a range of food growing practices that may include the keeping of chickens and/or bees, but does not include other livestock.
- 2. <u>Arbor:</u> An accessory structure consisting of an open frame, freestanding or attached to another structure, with horizontal and/or vertical lattice work often used as a support for climbing food or ornamental crops.
- 3. Aquaculture: means the cultivation of aquatic animals in a recirculating environment to produce whole fish that are distributed to retailers, restaurants, and consumers.
- 4. <u>Aquaponics:</u> The cultivation of fish and plants together in a constructed, re-circulating ecosystem utilizing natural bacterial cycles to convert fish waste to plant nutrients.
- 5. <u>Beekeeper</u>: means a person pr persons managing and maintaining honeybees in a hive or hives.
- 6. <u>Cold Frame</u>: An unheated outdoor structure built close to the ground, NO higher than thirty-six (36") inches, typically consisting of, but Not limited to, a wooden or concrete frame and a top of grass or clear plastic, used for protecting seedlings and plants from cold weather.
- 7. Colony: means a natural group of honeybees having a queen or queens.
- 8. <u>Composting</u>: means a process of accelerated biodegradation and stabilization of organic material under controlled conditions yielding a product which can be safely used as fertilization.
- 9. <u>Comprehensive Farm Review</u>: means an evaluation by the Food Justice staff of Revere on the Move for the overall design and siting of an Urban Farm and Farm Structures. Activities defined as Urban Agriculture must conform to the Zoning Code, specifically this ordinance, in all respects, and must be processed and approved by the Inspectional Services Department for the City of Revere.
- 10. Community Garden: Land that is gardened by a group of individuals sharing responsibility for the site either independently or under the auspices of the City of Revere or Nonprofit organization with a primary purpose of providing space for members of the community to grow plants for beautification, education, and recreation for personal use. Sales, processing and storage of plants or plant products are prohibited on-site, except at farmers markets. In all zones, community gardens on all public and private lands are subject to compliance with all applicable provisions of the garden rules set forth by the City of Revere and adapted by each community garden space and its leadership team.
- 11. <u>Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA):</u> means an agricultural technology that enables the grower to manipulate the environment to desired growing and/or cultivation conditions.
- 12. COOP: An enclosed shelter in which a chicken inhabits.
- 13. <u>Farm</u>: The area of a residential or commercial lot designated for activities and uses defined as Urban Agriculture. The cultivation and tillage of the soil, the production, planting, caring for, treating, growing, and harvesting of any agricultural, aquaculture, floricultural or horticultural commodities, the keeping and raising of hens and/or honeybees, sales subject to compliance of local, state, and federal regulations. Farming shall include aquaculture, aquaponic, hydroponic, rooftop farms on residential property.
- 14. <u>Farmers Market:</u> A public market administered by a market manager and held multiple times per year to connect and mutually benefit local farmers, communities, and shoppers. Vendors may include local farmers, farmers' cooperatives and producers selling any of the following: whole

- produce; value-added agricultural products that fall under Massachusetts Cottage Law such as jams, jellies, and pickles; prepared food; all agricultural, horticultural and aquacultural products including but Not limited to whole produce; plants flowers; meats; dairy products; shellfish and finfish; and other food related products.
- 15. <u>Farm Stand:</u> A temporary structure such as a table, stall or tent, for the display and sale of clean, whole, unprocessed produce, eggs, or honey grown on-site.
- 16. <u>Farm Structures:</u> Structures that may include but are Not limited to sheds (tool and packing), compost bins, rain buckets, shade pavilions, Farm Stands, trellises or other vertical supports for growing crops, and structures used to extend the growing season such as Greenhouses, Hoop Houses, Cold Frames, Freight Containers, and similar structures.
- 17. <u>Freight Container:</u> means a standardized reusable steel box previously used for the storage and movement of materials and products within an intermodal freight transport system and repurposed for a Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA) use, such as Hydroponics and/or Aquaponics.
- 18. <u>Gardens:</u> A planned space, set aside for the display, cultivation, and enjoyment of plants including vegetables, flowers, and fruits for private/personal use.
- 19. <u>Garden, Home/Yard:</u> An accessory use on a residential lot to grow plants for consumption, beautification, or recreation for personal use. The garden may be outdoors, in an accessory greenhouse or on the roof of a structure. The ownership, care and control is the responsibility of a resident of the dwelling on the lot. Sales are prohibited except at Farmers Markets.
- 20. <u>Greenhouse:</u> A structure, primarily of transparent material, in which temperature and humidity can be controlled for the cultivation or protection of plants or other agricultural products. All greenhouse structures are subject to setback and dimensional requirements of this title for accessory structures and building code requirements.
 - a) Greenhouse, Commercial: The primary use of a lot is commercial urban agriculture.
 - b) Greenhouse, Community: Urban agriculture or green house operated by a Nonprofit agency or the City of Revere.
- 21. <u>Ground Level Urban Farm:</u> means the use of a lot on the ground plane for Urban Agriculture for commercial or residential purposes, whether for profit or nonprofit.
- 22. Hens: Mature egg-laying female chickens.
- 23. <u>Hive:</u> means a manufactured receptacle or container prepared for the use of honeybees that includes movable frames, combs and substances deposited into the hive by honeybees intended for the housing of one bee colony.
- 24. Honeybee: A common domestic honeybee, Apis mellifera species.
- 25. <u>Hoop house</u>: A temporary accessory structure typically made of, but Not limited to piping or other material covered with translucent material for the purposes of growing food or ornamental crops.
- 26. <u>Hydroponics:</u> The cultivation of plants in nutrient solution of minerals in water rather than soil, for distribution to retailers, restaurants and consumers.
- 27. Local: means from Massachusetts, New England States and New York State.
- 28. <u>Open Air Rooftop Farm</u>: means an unenclosed area of a rooftop that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or nonprofit.

- 29. <u>Raised Bed</u>: means a method of cultivation in which soil is placed over a geotextile barrier, and raised and formed into three (3) to four (4) foot wide mounds. The soil may be enclosed by a frame generally made of untreated wood. Raised beds are Not considered a Structure.
- 30. <u>Roof Level Urban Farm</u>: means the use of a roof for Urban Agriculture for residential or commercial purposes, whether for profit or nonprofit.
- 31. <u>Rooftop Greenhouse</u>: means a structure located on a roof, primarily of transparent material, in which temperature and humidity can be controlled for the cultivation or protection of plants or other agricultural products in which plants are cultivated year- round.
- 32. <u>Urban Agriculture:</u> means the use of a lot for the cultivation of food and/or horticultural crops, Composting, Aquaponics, Aquaculture, and/or Hydroponics on City, commercial, or residential property. Such use may include the Accessory Keeping of Animals or Bees where allowed by underlying zoning.
- 33. <u>Urban Farm, Ground Level, Large:</u> means Ground Level Urban Farm with a farm area greater than one (1) acre that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or Nonprofit.
- 34. <u>Urban Farm, Ground Level, Medium</u>: means a Ground Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area greater than or equal to ten thousand (10,000) square feet but NO greater than one (1) acre that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or Nonprofit.
- 35. <u>Urban Farm, Ground Level, Small</u>: means a Ground Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area less than ten thousand (10,000) square feet that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial or residential purposes, whether for profit or Nonprofit.
- 36. <u>Urban Farm, Roof Level, Large</u>: means a Roof Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area greater than one (1) acre that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or Nonprofit.
- 37. <u>Urban Farm, Roof Level, Medium</u>: means a Roof Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area greater than or equal to five thousand (5,000) square feet but NO greater than one (1) acre that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or Nonprofit.
- 38. <u>Urban Farm, Roof Level, Small</u>: means a Roof Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area less than five thousand (5,000) square feet that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial or residential purposes, whether for profit or Nonprofit.
- 39. <u>Vertical Agriculture</u>: means an exterior building wall or other vertical structure designed to support the growing of agricultural or horticultural crops.

Section 3. Section 17.16.040 Generally – Table of Uses is hereby amended by inserting the following footnotes relative to permitted urban agricultural uses:

- (10) Hens shall be subject to the following rules: 1) Hens may be kept on residential properties only; 2) ownership, care and control of the hens shall be the responsibility of a resident of the dwelling on the lot; 3) a maximum of 6 hens may be kept on a lot, although Health regulations may further limit the number and/or manner of keeping of hens on lots; 4) No roosters may be kept on lots in Revere; 5) hen houses are subject to accessory structure setback and dimensional controls of this Title; 6) hens and henhouses are not permitted within front yards or in side yards that abut streets.
- (11) Honey Bees shall be subject to the following rules: 1) Honey bees may be kept on residential properties only; 2) ownership, care and control of the honey bees shall be the responsibility of a resident of the dwelling on the lot; 3) a maximum of 2 bee colonies may be kept on a lot, although Health regulations may further limit the number and/or manner of keeping of honey bees on lots; 4) a free standing bee hive shall be NO greater than twenty (20) cubic feet in volume; 5) the maximum height of a beehive or apiary shall be five (5) feet. This height limitation shall not apply to fences or other structures intended to separate a beehive or apiary from adjacent uses, which shall remain subject to applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance, Title 17; 6) Honey bees and bee keeping materials are not permitted in front yards or in side yards that abut streets; 7) where any beehive is located within ten (10) feet of a public street, park, school

grounds, walkway, or bikeway, a sign legible from the public way indicating that a beehive is present nearby shall be maintained so that it is readable from the public way; 8) where any beehive is located on a shared porch, balcony, or rooftop, or any shared structure or lot, a sign indicating that a beehive is present shall be located at the entrance to such area; 9) the keeping of honey bees may only be allowed in compliance with the Board of Health regulations for the keeping of bees and such regulations shall be enforceable by the Board of Health and/or the Department of Municipal Inspections; 10) any beekeeper that violates any provisions of this chapter or any rules and regulations promulgated hereunder shall be subject to the penalties set forth in Chapter 1.12 and 1.16 of the Revere Revised Ordinances.

- (12) Farm shall be subject to the following rules: 1) Farms may be kept on residential properties only; 2) ownership, care and control of the farm shall be the responsibility of a resident of the dwelling on the lot; 3) Land devoted to agricultural use shall be well maintained, regularly cleared of debris and free of excessively tall weeds and grass in accordance with City of Revere health regulations; 4) farms may include greenhouses as accessory structures, subject to applicable setbacks of this Title; 5) Accessory structures to an agricultural use shall also be well maintained in accordance with City of Revere health regulations.
- (13) Urban Farm, Roof Level, shall be subject to the following rules: 1) Small Roof Farms may be kept on residential properties only; 2) ownership, care and control of the farm shall be the responsibility of a resident of the dwelling on the lot; 3) the use of Small, Medium, Large Urban Farms Roof Level on nonprofit or commercial property is permitted as long as owners are within compliance with the building/safety fire codes.
- (14) Commercial farming/greenhouse, including but Not limited to hydroponic and aquaponic farming is permitted on municipal land, in municipal buildings, on roofs of municipal buildings and/or in greenhouses on municipal land. Products from such farms may be sold off-site, or sold on-site subject to the provisions of footnote (15).
- (15) On-site sale of products from these users are allowed subject to the following provisions: 1) Sales of products shall be permitted between the hours of 9:00am and 6:00pm, May 1 Oct. 31 of each year; 2) Sales of products shall be permitted Not more than (3) days per week and Not more than (25) days per year; 3) Retail sales display areas shall Not exceed fifty (50) square feet; 4) One farmstand is allowed per lot; however, NO sales display or structure shall be located on a public sidewalk, street or block vehicle and pedestrian flow; 5) Sales display, structure, and signage must be stored out of site while Not in use; 6) Signage shall be limited to one (1) sign and Not exceed six (6) square feet; and 7) Proof of annual soil testing must be posted during all sales of products.
- (16) Farms and Greenhouses shall be subject to building code requirements and any applicable rules and regulations established by the Health Department of the City of Revere.
- (17) Hoop houses, cold frames or other similar structures shall be allowed as accessory structures subject to the building code and subject to the following provisions: 1) they shall Not exceed a maximum height of six and one-half $(6 \frac{1}{2})$ feet; 2) the cover shall be removed and stored when plants are Not being cultivated.

(18) Community gardens on municipal property shall be in compliance with the City of Revere Community Garden Grower Rules and Regulations.



Please find attached a finalized version of the Urban Farming Ordinance for your consideration to send to public hearing. The ordinance is geared towards regulating urban farming on residential and commercial properties and provides for the various facets of urban farming including regulations for honey bee keeping, keeping of hens, cultivation of plants and vegetables, aquaculture, aquaponics, and hydroponics. Included in the ordinance is a use regulation table which regulates such uses as keeping of hens, keeping of honey bees, home/yard gardens, ground level farms, roof level farms, greenhouses, and community gardens by zoning district. Also incorporated into the ordinance are strict regulations for the keeping of honey bees and keeping of hens on residential properties, which will be enforced by the Board of Health. This ordinance has also been reviewed and approved by the City Solicitor as well as Revere on the Move prior to being submitted to the City Council.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR URBAN AGRICULTURE, ACCESORY USE RESIDENTIAL FARMS, AND COMMUNITY GARDENS, FARMS, AND FARMNG ON MUNICIPAL PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, the City of Revere is committed to increasing access to fresh, locally grown, wholesome foods for all residents; and,

WHEREAS, as national leaders in innovative government practice, Revere on the Move and its local partners have established a wide and increasing variety of programs and resources for access to fresh food; and,

WHEREAS, state and national policies are encouraging home gardeners to produce their own food; and,

WHEREAS, there is local interest in additional community gardens, community farms, and small commercial farms; and,

WHEREAS, growing local foods eliminates both the need for fossil fuels in transporting food and the use of destructive chemicals that are part of large-scale food production operations; and,

WHEREAS, urban agriculture at a residential scale provides a valuable supplement to a family food budget; and,

WHEREAS, urban agriculture at a residential scale provides an invaluable opportunity for students to learn about nutrition and where food comes from; and,

WHEREAS, new technologies for growing food, including indoor growing technologies such as aquaponics and hydroponics are the basis for new agricultural opportunities, partnerships and research; now,

THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Revere as follows:

Chapter 17.16 Use Regulations is hereby amended by inserting a new section as follows:

Chapter 17.16.470 Urban Agriculture

Section 1. Definitions:

- Agriculture, Urban (Urban Agriculture): An umbrella term that describes a range of food growing practices that may include the keeping of chickens and/or bees, but does not include other livestock.
- 2. <u>Arbor:</u> An accessory structure consisting of an open frame, freestanding or attached to another structure, with horizontal and/or vertical lattice work often used as a support for climbing food or ornamental crops.

- 3. <u>Aquaculture:</u> means the cultivation of aquatic animals in a recirculating environment to produce whole fish that are distributed to retailers, restaurants and consumers.
- 4. <u>Aquaponics:</u> The cultivation of fish and plants together in a constructed, re-circulating ecosystem utilizing natural bacterial cycles to convert fish waste to plant nutrients.
- 5. <u>Beekeeper</u>: means a person pr persons managing and maintaining Honey Bees in a Hive or Hives.
- 6. <u>Cold Frame</u>: An unheated outdoor structure built close to the ground, no higher than thirty-six (36") inches, typically consisting of, but not limited to, a wooden or concrete frame and a top of grass or clear plastic, used for protecting seedlings and plants from cold weather.
- 7. Colony: means a natural group of Honey Bees having a queen or queens.
- 8. <u>Composting</u>: means a process of accelerated biodegradation and stabilization of organic material under controlled conditions yielding a product which can be safely used as fertilization.
- 9. <u>Comprehensive Farm Review</u>: means an evaluation by the Food Justice staff of Revere on the Move for the overall design and siting of an Urban Farm and Farm Structures. Activities defined as Urban Agriculture must conform to the Zoning Code, specifically this ordinance, in all respects, and must be processed and approved by the Inspectional Services Department for the City of Revere.
- 10. Community Garden: Land that is gardened by a group of individuals sharing responsibility for the site either independently or under the auspices of the City of Revere or nonprofit organization with a primary purpose of providing space for members of the community to grow plants for beautification, education, and recreation for personal use. Sales, processing and storage of plants or plant products are prohibited on-site, except at farmers markets. In all zones, community gardens on all public and private lands are subject to compliance with all applicable provisions of the garden rules set forth by the City of Revere and adapted by each community garden space and its leadership team.
- 11. <u>Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA):</u> means an agricultural technology that enables the grower to manipulate the environment to desired growing and/or cultivation conditions.
- 12. COOP: An enclosed shelter in which a chicken inhabits.
- 13. <u>Farm</u>: The area of a residential or commercial lot designated for activities and uses defined as Urban Agriculture. The cultivation and tillage of the soil, the production, planting, caring for, treating, growing, and harvesting of any agricultural, aquaculture, floricultural or horticultural commodities, the keeping and raising of hens and/or honey bees, sales subject to compliance of local, state, and federal regulations. Farming shall include aquaculture, aquaponic, hydroponic, rooftop farms on residential property.
- 14. Farmers Market: A public market administered by a market manager and held multiple times per year to connect and mutually benefit local farmers, communities, and shoppers. Vendors may include local farmers, farmers' cooperatives and producers selling any of the following: whole produce; value-added agricultural products that fall under Massachusetts Cottage Law such as jams, jellies, and pickles; prepared food; all agricultural, horticultural and aquacultural products including but not limited to whole produce; plants flowers; meats; dairy products; shellfish and finfish; and other food related products.

- 15. <u>Farm Stand:</u> A temporary structure such as a table, stall or tent, for the display and sale of clean, whole, unprocessed produce, eggs, or honey grown on-site.
- 16. <u>Farm Structures:</u> Structures that may include but are not limited to sheds (tool and packing), compost bins, rain buckets, shade pavilions, Farm Stands, trellises or other vertical supports for growing crops, and structures used to extend the growing season such as Greenhouses, Hoop Houses, Cold Frames, Freight Containers, and similar structures.
- 17. <u>Freight Container:</u> means a standardized reusable steel box previously used for the storage and movement of materials and products within an intermodal freight transport system and repurposed for a Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA) use, such as Hydroponics and/or Aguaponics.
- 18. <u>Gardens:</u> A planned space, set aside for the display, cultivation, and enjoyment of plants including vegetables, flowers, and fruits for private/personal use.
- 19. <u>Garden, Home/Yard:</u> An accessory use on a residential lot to grow plants for consumption, beautification, or recreation for personal use. The garden may be outdoors, in an accessory greenhouse or on the roof of a structure. The ownership, care and control is the responsibility of a resident of the dwelling on the lot. Sales are prohibited except at Farmers Markets.
- 20. <u>Greenhouse:</u> A structure, primarily of transparent material, in which temperature and humidity can be controlled for the cultivation or protection of plants or other agricultural products. All greenhouse structures are subject to setback and dimensional requirements of this title for accessory structures and building code requirements.
 - a) Greenhouse, Commercial: The primary use of a lot is commercial urban agriculture.
 - b) Greenhouse, Community: Urban agriculture or green house operated by a nonprofit agency or the City of Revere.
- 21. <u>Ground Level Urban Farm:</u> means the use of a lot on the ground plane for Urban Agriculture for commercial or residential purposes, whether for profit or non profit.
- 22. Hens: Mature egg-laying female chickens.
- 23. <u>Hive:</u> means a manufactured receptacle or container prepared for the use of Honey Bees that includes movable frames, combs and substances deposited into the Hive by Honey Bees intended for the housing of one bee colony.
- 24. Honeybee: A common domestic honeybee, Apis mellifera species.
- 25. <u>Hoop house</u>: A temporary accessory structure typically made of, but not limited to piping or other material covered with translucent material for the purposes of growing food or ornamental crops.
- 26. <u>Hydroponics:</u> The cultivation of plants in nutrient solution of minerals in water rather than soil, for distribution to retailers, restaurants and consumers.
- 27. Local: means from Massachusetts, New England States and New York State.
- 28. <u>Open Air Rooftop Farm</u>: means an unenclosed area of a rooftop that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or non profit.

- 29. <u>Raised Bed</u>: means a method of cultivation in which soil is placed over a geotextile barrier, and raised and formed into three (3) to four (4) foot wide mounds. The soil may be enclosed by a frame generally made of untreated wood. Raised beds are not considered a Structure.
- 30. <u>Roof Level Urban Farm</u>: means the use of a roof for Urban Agriculture for residential or commercial purposes, whether for profit or non profit.
- 31. <u>Rooftop Greenhouse</u>: means a structure located on a roof, primarily of transparent material, in which temperature and humidity can be controlled for the cultivation or protection of plants or other agricultural products in which plants are cultivated year-round.
- 32. <u>Urban Agriculture:</u> means the use of a lot for the cultivation of food and/or horticultural crops, Composting, Aquaponics, Aquaculture, and/or Hydroponics on City, commercial, or residential property. Such use may include the Accessory Keeping of Animals or Bees where allowed by underlying zoning.
- 33. <u>Urban Farm, Ground Level, Large:</u> means Ground Level Urban Farm with a farm area greater than one (1) acre that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or non profit.
- 34. <u>Urban Farm, Ground Level, Medium</u>: means a Ground Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area greater than or equal to ten thousand (10,000) square feet but no greater than one (1) acre that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or nonprofit.
- 35. <u>Urban Farm, Ground Level, Small</u>: means a Ground Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area less than ten thousand (10,000) square feet that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial or residential purposes, whether for profit or non profit.
- 36. <u>Urban Farm, Roof Level, Large</u>: means a Roof Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area greater than one (1) acre that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or non profit.
- 37. <u>Urban Farm, Roof Level, Medium</u>: means a Roof Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area greater than or equal to five thousand (5,000) square feet but no greater than one (1) acre that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial purposes, whether for profit or non profit.
- 38. <u>Urban Farm, Roof Level, Small</u>: means a Roof Level Urban Farm with a Farm Area less than five thousand (5,000) square feet that is used for Urban Agriculture for commercial or residential purposes, whether for profit or non profit.
- 39. <u>Vertical Agriculture</u>: means an exterior building wall or other vertical structure designed to support the growing of agricultural or horticultural crops.

This height limitation shall not apply to fences or other structures intended to separate a beehive or apiary from adjacent uses, which shall remain subject to applicable provisions of the Zoning Ordinance, Title 17; 6) Honey bees and bee keeping materials are not permitted in front yards or in side yards that abut streets; 7) where any beehive is located within ten (10) feet of a public street, park, school grounds, walkway, or bikeway, a sign legible from the public way indicating that a beehive is present nearby shall be maintained so that it is readable from the public way; 8) where any beehive is located on a shared porch, balcony, or rooftop, or any shared structure or lot, a sign indicating that a beehive is present shall be located at the entrance to such area; 9) the keeping of honey bees may only be allowed in compliance with the Board of Health regulations for the keeping of bees and such regulations shall be enforceable by the Board of Health and/or the Department of Municipal Inspections; 10) any beekeeper that violates any provisions of this chapter or

any rules and regulations promulgated hereunder shall be subject to the penalties set forth in Chapter 1.12 and 1.16 of the Revere Revised Ordinances.

- (12) Farm shall be subject to the following rules: 1) Farms may be kept on residential properties only; 2) ownership, care and control of the farm shall be the responsibility of a resident of the dwelling on the lot; 3) Land devoted to agricultural use shall be well maintained, regularly cleared of debris and free of excessively tall weeds and grass in accordance with City of Revere health regulations; 4) farms may include greenhouses as accessory structures, subject to applicable setbacks of this Title; 5) Accessory structures to an agricultural use shall also be well maintained in accordance with City of Revere health regulations.
- (13) Urban Farm, Roof Level, shall be subject to the following rules: 1) Small Roof Farms may be kept on residential properties only; 2) ownership, care and control of the farm shall be the responsibility of a resident of the dwelling on the lot; 3) the use of Small, Medium, Large Urban Farms Roof Level on nonprofit or commercial property is permitted as long as owners are within compliance with the building/safety fire codes.
- (14) Commercial farming/greenhouse, including but not limited to hydroponic and aquaponic farming is permitted on municipal land, in municipal buildings, on roofs of municipal buildings and/or in greenhouses on municipal land. Products from such farms may be sold off-site, or sold on-site subject to the provisions of footnote (15).
- (15) On-site sale of products from these users are allowed subject to the following provisions: 1) Sales of products shall be permitted between the hours of 9:00am and 6:00pm, May 1 Oct. 31 of each year; 2) Sales of products shall be permitted not more than (3) days per week and not more than (25) days per year; 3) Retail sales display areas shall not exceed fifty (50) square feet; 4) One farmstand is allowed per lot; however, no sales display or structure shall be located on a public sidewalk, street or block vehicle and pedestrian flow; 5) Sales display, structure, and signage must be stored out of site while not in use; 6) Signage shall be limited to one (1) sign and not exceed six (6) square feet; and 7) Proof of annual soil testing must be posted during all sales of products.
- (16) Farms and Greenhouses shall be subject to building code requirements and any applicable rules and regulations established by the Health Department of the City of Revere.
- (17) Hoop houses, cold frames or other similar structures shall be allowed as accessory structures subject to the building code and subject to the following provisions: 1) they shall not exceed a maximum height of six and one-half (6 ½) feet; 2) the cover shall be removed and stored when plants are not being cultivated.
- (18) Community gardens on municipal property shall be in compliance with the City of Revere Community Garden Grower Rules and Regulations.



Dear Council President Zambuto,

As discussed in the communication to the Council regarding FY2022 recommended rates for the Water and Sewer, I am respectfully requesting that the City Council appropriate \$2 million dollars from the Water and Sewer Stabilization Fund to the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund to stabilize the rates for FY2022.

As you are aware, the City has systematically appropriated 15% of all certified retained earnings over the last several years to build up a healthy balance in the Water and Sewer Stabilization fund. These certified retained earnings are a result of revenues collected more than budgeted as well as any appropriation turn backs at the end of each fiscal year.

Conservative budgeting and responsible spending have served the City well, and, as a result, we now have nearly \$7.5 million in our Water and Sewer Stabilization Fund. These reserves are typically used for extraordinary and unforeseen events. During the pandemic, many of the City's residents and stakeholders have suffered financially and any further increases in the water and sewer rates would certainly present further financial struggles to many in the City.

Therefore, I respectfully request that the City approve a transfer of \$2 million to help reduce the impact of the increased fixed costs of the Water and Sewer Enterprise fund.

I will attend Monday's Council meeting to answer any question about the above request.

Dear Council President Zambuto,

I am writing to inform you that, pursuant to his authority under Title 13, Chapter 13.08, Section 13.08.580 of the revised ordinances of the City of Revere, the Superintendent of Public Works has determined that the new sewer rates for FY2022 shall be \$12.25 per hundred cubic feet (HCF) for residential property owners and \$20.20 per HCF for commercial property owners, effective for billings as of July 1, 2021. With respect to the water rates, pursuant to Title 13, Chapter 13.04, Section 13.04.130 of the revised ordinances of the City of Revere, I am hereby recommending to the City Council that it adopt a rate of \$4.06 per HCF for residential property owners and \$6.73 per HCF for commercial owners, effective for billings as of July 1 2021.

If the Council adopts the recommended adjustments, the combined residential rate will be \$16.31 per HCF and the combined commercial rate will be \$26.93 per HCF. This rate represents a 3.9% increase from the FY2021 rates. As you may recall, rates were kept flat, with 0% increase for FY2021 as we managed the pandemic.

During FY2021, to help reduce expenses, the City restructured its debt service payments with the MWRA to defer payments while we recovered from the pandemic. These deferrals have increased expenses in debt service for FY2022 and beyond. Furthermore, the City permanently bonded eight (8) loans from the Clean Water Trust that totaled \$11.8 million. The City was previously paying 0% interest on these temporary bonds, however, once permanently financed, both principal and interest are due on these bonds. This has increased our debt service payments in FY2022 from \$5.7 million to \$6.6 million. Please remember that the consent decree, which was issued by the Department of Justice, is the driving force behind the wor that has been done and will continue to be done to the City's infrastructure.

Furthermore, to achieve these rates and avoid having to raise them further, I am requesting that the Council appropriate \$2 million from the Water and Sewer Stabilization fund to the Water and Sewer Enterprise fund. Currently, the Water and Sewer Stabilization fund has nearly \$7.5 million dollars in assets.

I respectfully urge the City Council to adopt the proposed rates to avoid any deficits in the Water and Sewer Enterprise fund for FY2022. I will attend Monday's Council meeting to answer any questions.






