- Please list each position that is paid out of the Water & Sewer Fund as a "Shared Employee" and please provide the amount they were paid out of the Water & Sewer Fund in FY12, FY13, FY14, FY15 and projected in FY16.

- Please list each facility that is paid out of the Water & Sewer Fund as a "Shared Facility" and please provide the amount they were paid out of the Water & Sewer Fund in FY12, FY13, FY14, FY15 and projected in FY16.
- Does the city conduct any outside/independent reviews of the work being done by CDM Smith? Has the city considered an independent review of CDM Smith's work? If not, explain why.
