- <u>13-028</u> Pursuant to MGl c. 166 s. 22, petition from Crown Castle NG East, Inc. for a permit to install conduit and fiber locations to existing utility and street light poles on Franklin and Walnut Avenues.
- <u>13-055</u> Motion presented by Councillor Correggio: That the Mayor request the DPW Superintendent appear before the Public Works Sub-Committee to examine the guidelines used for hiring plow drivers to include but not limited to truck size, equipment, and operator capability. I have received many complaints about undersized trucks plowing during the previous blizzard and complaints about damage to parked vehicles. Further, that flags or signage be used on the City of Revere trucks for identifying purposes.

Also, that the City Council also be advised as to what steps need to be taken to correct the problems in the area of 611 660 Revere Beach Boulevard to prevent raw sewage from backing up into homes in that area.
