Support People in Treatment & Recovery – Access to Housing	\$48,500	<p><b>Sober Home/Detox Voucher Program</b>            3-month voucher/scholarship program for people who are entering a Sober Home or who need a Detox Bed. This would primarily be used by people without commercial insurance or those with no insurance.</p>
Support People in Treatment & Recovery – Comprehensive Wrap-Around Services	\$48,500	<p><b>High-Intensity Case Manager</b>            LCSW, LICSW, LMHC or other accredited social worker will be contracted to work exclusively with people that have been housed successfully through the COC. The purpose of this social worker would be to help people with OUD, who have been successfully housed to stay housed. We've noticed that many struggling with OUD don't successfully maintain housing once they move through the COC process. This High-Intensity Social worker would focus on a small amount of clients and work with them intensely to ensure that housing can be successfully maintained.</p>



<p>Prevent Misuse of Opioids &amp; Implement Prevention Education – Prevent Drug Misuse Among Youth</p>	<p>\$50,000          (Part of the RIZE Foundation Grant Program)</p>	<p><b>Revere Adolescent Wellness Program</b>          A partnership between the city’s Substance Use Office, and two youth mentorship organizations: Revere Boxing Outreach and Revere Police Athletic League to provide a formalized prevention framework for 15 – 30 youth in Revere. The frameworks includes about 6-7 trainings focused on prevention techniques taught by a social worker.</p>
<p>Support People in Treatment &amp; Recovery – Support Bereaved Families</p>	<p>\$10,000</p>	<p><b>Grief Support for Families affected by OUD</b>          Burial Support for families or loved ones who have had someone pass away from OUD/overdose.</p>
<p>Harm Reduction – Training and Education regarding naloxone</p>	<p>\$13,000</p>	<p><b>Continued Business – Narcan Outreach</b>          Continuation of a successful FY25 program where in-person outreach occurs at local businesses to perform staff Narcan trainings. Free Narcan and educational materials are provided to businesses as well</p>
<p>Harm Reduction – Outreach and services for people who use drugs</p>	<p>\$8,000</p>	<p><b>Basic Needs</b>          Quick, small dollars needs for homeless individuals with OUD can be granted through a Venmo transfer with the city’s contracted Outreach Workers. Expenses that are eligible include laundry expenses, fees for driver’s</p>



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		licenses or Mass IDs, hygiene supplies, etc.
Opioid Use Disorder Treatment – Expand mobile treatment	\$65,000	<b>Street Medicine Contract</b> Contract with a local MAT prescribing primary care provider to provide street medicine visits with our known OUD population. This would be a contracted amount of hours per week when the MD would be working on the streets of Revere with OUD clients.
