Item #3: Updates/Next Steps from December 10, 2024 Meeting

- Updates from Pauline & Annmarie regarding the calendar for future monthly guest speakers.
- Draft letter from Pauline (Tabled from December meeting)
- Annmarie Formal Plan for Music Therapy Program- Possibly include 3 preliminary workshops. COD
 wants to present a letter about a partnership with the Revere Parks and Rec Center. COD will
 fund this.

Item #4: Discussion regarding the Community Music Center of Boston Proposal. As a Commission, we always seek programs we can implement in Revere to benefit children and young adults with disabilities.

Item #5: CODA (Commissions on Disabilities Alliance) – Meeting Wednesday, January 8, 2025

- A COD Member from Acton had questions regarding emergency preparedness plans for communities, especially developments with residents with disabilities.
- Newburyport COD spoke about brick sidewalks and how the town is against removing them even
 though they cause difficulties for people with disabilities. They have the older style of brick and
 not the wire-cut type. Even wire-cut bricks need to be maintained. A member from the town of
 Newton mentioned that they have instituted and replaced brick sidewalks with stamped
 concrete that looks like brick. This is a better version than the older style of stamped concrete.
 It can be colored to look like any style needed.
- Various CODs discussed ride-share bike programs. The Newburyport Cod mentioned that they
 have adopted a new program that includes one adaptable bike. They have an RFP out now. The
 City of Boston member mentioned that they are part of the Blue Bikes ride-share program and
 also purchased an adaptive bike. The only issue they have with it is that it is not in use because
 of its size and docking needs. The Acton COD mentioned they have a bike share program as part
 of the town's Recreation center for people to rent.

Newburyport COD mentioned a program that they are looking at called the Right-Hear, www.right-hear.com. Right-Hear is a program that provides talking signage so everyone can interpret and understand their surroundings in real-time. This application and program incorporates the use of a mobile device and installed beacons. The environment comes to life through audio descriptions delivered directly to a smartphone or tablet. Helping everyone, everywhere explore, navigate, and experience the world safely and independently. They want to see if this could be implemented on trails and parkland in their community.

Item #6: Commission Members Late Items/Information

- Chair DeCicco mentioned that Governor Healey signed S201, the Pharmaceutical Affordability Bill.
- Chair DeCicco Mentioned that Revere Rec Center contacted him about partnering on an Art Program they are looking to implement in which the COD will help fund for students and young adults with disabilities.
- The COD has helped the City of Revere purchase and install a new ADA podium in the Council Chambers. The COD could do this with funds established through Chapter 40, Section 22G of HP Violations collected.
- The COD has applied for the Save the Harbor/Save the Bay & The Department of Conservation and Recreation's Better Beaches Grant Program Application. This is the same grant we applied for and were awarded, which allowed us to have the All-Abilities Day out at Revere Beach in August 2024
- Commission member Jason Barone spoke about MassHealth's Yearly PCA Review process.
