TIME TO PROTECT FAUCETS PIPES FROM FREEZING!

With cold weather coming, now's the time to make sure your pipes aren't vulnerable to freezing and bursting.

The first things to do:

- Close basement vents to protect indoor pipes.
- Turn off the supply to outdoor faucets and showers.
- · Drain the pipes and shut off water to uninsulated seasonal buildings.
