Notice has been received from the State Alcohol & Marijuana Control Office (AMCO) for the following marijuana license renewal applications:

Pursuant to FGC Sec. 14-214 and 3 AAC 306.060, the Council may determine whether to protest a marijuana license renewal application after holding a public hearing. As required by FGC Sec. 14-214(b), I have sent written notice of the public hearing to the above-listed licensee. The 60-day response deadline to AMCO for these marijuana license renewal applications is January 7, 2026.

Pursuant to FGC Sec. 14-215(b)(12), I have inquired about complaints filed within the past 12 months with the Fairbanks North Star Borough (FNSB) and AMCO in regard to these marijuana establishments. FNSB reported no complaints.

AMCO provided the attached advisory notice for license no. 11927 issued in March 2025. I made contact with a manager at the retail store who claimed that the signage issue had been resolved to AMCO's satisfaction. I was not able to obtain a copy of the documentation to support that by the publishing of this agenda packet.

There are no department-recommended protests for these license renewal applications. However, the Building Official noted that the cultivation facility "must address outstanding comments prior to next year's inspection. Backflow preventor at water service needs to be tested and certified."

This is a notice to you as licensee that an incident has occurred or a defect is noted that could result in a violation of a statute, regulation or municipal ordinance.

Note: This is not an accusation or a criminal complaint.

On 2-26-25, an inspection was conducted at your establishment. Of particular note were two violations. Your "No one under 21 years of age allowed" at the entrance to the facility does not meet regulatory requirements. Lastly, the entrance to the restricted access area, which leads into the retail store, does not have the "Restricted access area. Visitors must be escorted" sign posted.

Your attention is directed to 3 AAC 306.325: Access restricted at retail marijuana store which reads in part, "(b) Each entry to a retail marijuana store must be posted with a sign that says "No one under 21 years of age allowed." The sign must be not less than 12 inches long and 12 inches wide, with letters at least one-half inch in height in high contrast to the background of the sign... and 3 AAC 306.710: Restricted access areas which also reads in part, "(b) Except as provided in 3 AAC 306.325 for a retail marijuana store, each entrance to a restricted access area must be marked by a sign that says "Restricted access area. Visitors must be escorted." A marijuana establishment shall limit the number of visitors to not more than five visitors for each licensee, employee, or agent of the licensee who is actively engaged in supervising those visitors.....

FFY2024 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG)**

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks has been notified by the Alaska Department of Commerce, Community, and Economic Development that the City has been awarded \$639,000 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks was awarded funds to upgrade the Moore Street parking lot by repaving and fixing drainage issues, cracks, and obstructions; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fairbanks owns the land (see Attachment A); the value of the land at 1420 and 1424 Moore Street will provide a 25% in-kind match, and Moore Street Seniors, Inc. will provide an additional \$1,000 cash match.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council that the Mayor or her designee is authorized to execute any and all documents required for accepting funds on behalf of the City for the Community Development Block Grant.

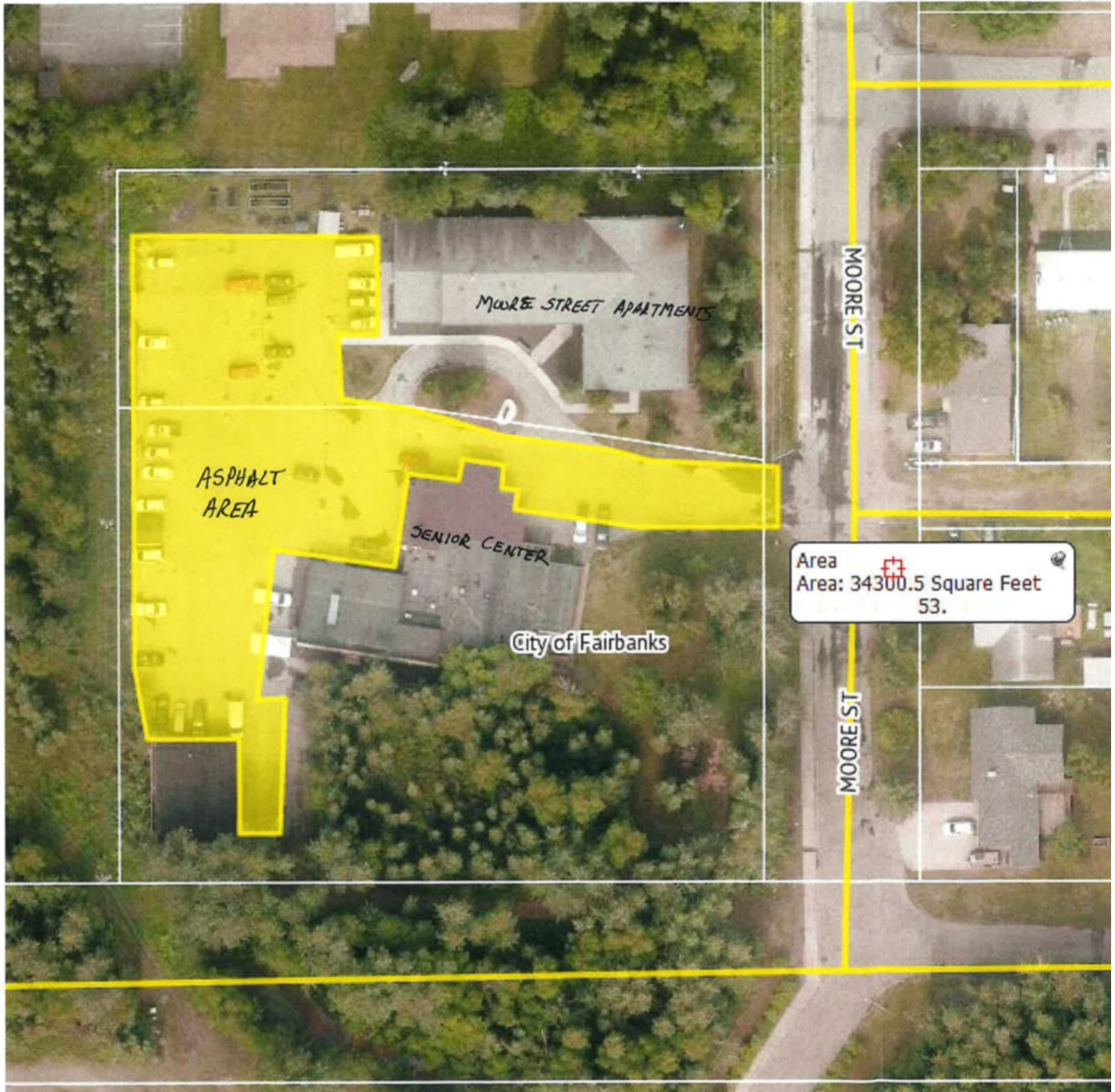

The value of the land at 1420 (\$130,675) & 1424 (\$465,482) Moore Street will provide the 25% in-kind match for the grant, with Moore Street Seniors, Inc. providing a \$1,000 additional cash match for the project. Moore Street Seniors, Inc. will be responsible for maintenance and operations associated with this upgrade.

ORDINANCE NO. 6331

**AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE 2026 OPERATING
AND CAPITAL BUDGETS**

WHEREAS, pursuant to City Charter Section 5.2, on October 31, 2025, Mayor O'Neill presented a recommended annual operating and capital budget estimate for 2026; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget was reviewed by the City Council with Department Directors, and the City Council's suggested changes to the Mayor's recommended budget are disclosed in the increase (decrease) columns.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows [amendments shown in **bold** font; deleted text in ~~font~~]:

SECTION 1. ORDINANCE NO. 6332

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING FAIRBANKS GENERAL CODE
SECTION 2-119(a), ORDER OF BUSINESS, REQUIRING A LAND
ACKNOWLEDGMENT AT EVERY REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING**

WHEREAS, in 2021 and 2022, the Fairbanks City Council worked with Denakkanaaga Elders to create a land acknowledgment that would be appropriate for the City to offer on its publications, signage, and prior to meetings and conferences; and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 4981 was proposed to add the land acknowledgment at the beginning of regular City Council meetings and, at the request of the City Council, the Fairbanks Diversity Council reviewed the Resolution and voted unanimously to recommend the Resolution be approved; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that a Land Acknowledgment, by itself, is a small gesture but it becomes meaningful when coupled with authentic relationships and informed actions and that a Land Acknowledgment can function as a living celebration of Indigenous communities; and

WHEREAS, although Resolution No. 4981 was ultimately not enacted, the recommended Land Acknowledgment was posted at the entrance to the City Council Chambers for all to see.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FAIRBANKS, ALASKA, as follows:

Section 1. That Fairbanks General Code at Section 2-119(a) is hereby amended as follows [new text in **bold/underline** font; deleted text in ~~striketrough~~ font]:

Sec. 2-119. - Order of business; citizens addressing city council.

(a) At every regular meeting of the city council, the order of business shall be as follows:

(1) Roll call.

(2) Land Acknowledgment: We respectfully acknowledge the Dena people upon whose traditional lands we reside. We honor the Dena who have been the stewards of Interior lands and waters for centuries, the Elders who lived here before, the Dena people of today, and future generations to come. We also recognize that Alaskan Native people would traditionally gather here and harvest Native foods.

(23) Invocation.

(34) Flag salutation.

(~~45~~) Ceremonial matters (proclamations, introductions, recognitions, and awards).

(~~56~~) Citizens' comments (oral communications to the city council on items not up for public hearing). The comment period will not exceed a total of 30 minutes unless extended by a council vote.

(~~67~~) Approval of agenda and consent agenda. Consent agenda items are indicated by asterisks (*). Consent agenda items are considered together unless a council member requests that the item be returned to the general agenda. Ordinances on the approved consent agenda are automatically advanced to the next regular meeting for second reading and public hearing. All other items on the approved consent agenda are passed as final.
