





#### **Patient Age and Sex**




#### Patient Gender\*




## **Payor Source of Patients**




## **Preferred Languages of Patients**



## **Community Partnerships**

#### Recuperative Care at 934 Congress St

In September 2022, Greater Portland Health opened Maine's very first recuperative care center at 934 Congress Street in partnership with Maine Medical Center (MMC) and Preble St Resource Center.

Recuperative care is acute and post-acute medical care for people with unstable housing who are too ill or frail to recover from a physical illness or injury on the streets or in a shelter but are not ill enough to require hospital level care. Recuperative care provides the opportunity to recover in a safe environment while accessing medical care and other supportive services.

Through the partnership with MMC, GPH was able to occupy a space owned by MMC, and eligible patients are now able to recuperate at 934 Congress St after their stay at MMC. During their stay, clients will receive medical care from Greater Portland Health as well case management and behavioral health services from Preble Street.

This was a project 3 years in the making, and GPH is thrilled to be able to strengthen our community partnerships and make this program a reality.

#### **Services Offered:**

- Medical care: Primary care, wound care, and infectious disease treatment
- Behavioral health: Mental health treatment,
   behavioral health services and substance
   use treatment
- Social services: Medical case management as well as screening and addressing social determinants of health including housing, food access, and transportation
- Basic needs: Meals and sleeping accommodations for up to 15 patients

## **2022 Highlights**

#### New Mainer Clinics at 295 Park Ave

In late 2022, Greater Portland Health began holding clinics for New Mainers every Saturday in order to treat the influx of New Mainers moving into the greater Portland area. These clinics were held at what was soon to be GPH's newest location, 295 Park Ave.

Last year, a large number of New Mainers came to the Greater Portland Area, many seeking refuge. GPH held these clinics in order to help them establish healthcare in Maine as quickly as possible, receive proper vaccinations, and address existing health concerns. Over the course of 2022, GPH treated BLANK New Mainers.

In 2022, GPH also renovated 295 Park Ave to be what is now our newest fully operational health center! 295 is located right down the street from our 180 Park Ave location and GPH is hopeful that this location will eventually be home to future additional health services.
