The 2014 camping season officially ended October 19, 2014. Camp opened on April 21, 2014 with a four day nature camp, sponsored by the Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed. Our last event was a wedding held on October 18th. Once again we have been able to stretch out the time camp has stayed open. Y Camp continues to serve a variety of groups and organizations. We served 34 different groups, organizations or individual wedding groups at our facility this year. The camp program itself served more than 600 individual campers including campers from France, Spain, Canada, China, Italy, Germany, Saipan, Scotland, Netherlands and Mexico; along with a host of States and towns, and of course, children from Maine. Some sessions filled to capacity and we had to turn campers away, so don't wait to reserve your child's spot by applying on line January 1, 2015. It is exciting to see how the YMCA Camp of Maine can be used by so many different groups for so many different functions. We are doing our best to be a community resource for so many individuals and groups.

Greeley High School High School held their **Project Graduation** celebration here in June. We welcomed back the "Onward Bound Program" from the University of Maine, Orono. Schools attending camp in the spring and fall for overnights were Hill View Montessori School MA, Park **Elementary**, **Sherwood Heights** and Walton Elementary from Auburn and the Windsor School. The Friends of the Cobbossee Watershed held two weeks of Environmental Day Camp. The YMCA Camp was the catalyst for training staff to work in other camps by offering a Certification School, covering trainings in Basic Wilderness First Aid, CPR/First Aid and Archery.

of training at the YMCA Camp in
May which resulted in the complete
refurbishing of our girl's village cabins
and female bathroom/shower facility.
This completes our remodeling of the
