

2021 DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

With a huge, heartfelt THANK YOU, this summer was AWESOME! No - it wasn't easy. BUT - campers connected with each other in new ways. Lifetime memories were created. Friends were made. Despite the extra steps and precautions we took this summer, YCamp 2021 was special.

The YCamp Experience is always about bringing people together and growing. As we have emerged from quarantines, lock downs, seclusion, virtual learning, and major upsets in our family traditions, coming back together as a YCamp Community was spectacular. We were able to get back together and grow!

Because of our campers, our families, our community, our staff, we were able to have a COVID FREE summer. Immunizations, tests, masks, hand washing, eating outside - we all chipped in and were a part of the process. 100% of our staff were vaccinated this summer. 90% of our 12+ year old campers were vaccinated. 376 COVID tests were administered at Camp this summer to ensure our "COVID FREE" status. 1,922 face masks were distributed.

Planning for the summer of 2022 is well underway. Applications for campers of returning families opened on October 1 and new families can start applying as of November 1.



There are aspects of the 2021 summer which helped us grow stronger and we are going to continue (for example: eating meals outside). Other aspects of last summer we hope to leave behind (like... face masks all the time). Plans about this summer and YCamp's future are discussed more in this edition of the Pine Cone. We will communicate more specifics with you regarding health and safety precautions for summer 2022 as we know more.

We are excited to be back together, again, soon! Stay healthy, active, and well.

WHAT HAPPENED IN 2021?

We hosted 351 campers from 19 U.S. states. We remained COVID-free all summer as a result of campers' and parents' vigilance leading up to and during Camp. And, lots of testing!

Our staff represented 9 U.S. states as well as Mexico, Colombia, Jamaica, and Canada. Several staff arrived at camp unvaccinated and we worked with our local Hannaford Pharmacy to provide the necessary vaccinations to keep our community safe. Before campers arrived, we were 100% vaccinated.

Week 1 of every session was spent fostering a strong connection within the cabins as they experienced new activities in each of the program areas with their cabinmates, ate family-style meals together, and spent Rec Time with their village.

Fan-favorite evening programs like the Camp-a-ret and the Disco were hosted outdoors.





Campers were able to create their own schedule and experience activity periods with campers from other cabins and villages during Week 2.

Rec Time was introduced and enjoyed by all as a free period before dinner. Campers could choose to free swim, play on the courts, chill in the grove, or participate in one of the many other activities like tiedye, creature catching, or island swim that changed each day.

Meals were enjoyed outdoors at the new picnic tables funded for and built by the YCamp Community.



Parent and counselor surveys showed increased connections within cabins and Units.
Campers expressed appreciation for trying new things. Counselors were more specialized than previous summers and commented on a greater sense of program ownership.

Made possible by donations this year, Mooma's Porch was added to the back of the Dining Hall for more outdoor gathering space, Mooma's Cabin was built to house the Girls Unit Leaders, and renovations were made to Maine Porch in Girls' Village.

The garden doubled in size and helped supply the salad bar with fresh lettuce, kale, and more. THANKS to Martha Simpson and the Maine Ag in the Classroom grant for helping to make our gardens possible.

Chef Mike offered a delicious variety of meals and worked to provide more locally-sourced meat and produce than ever!

Throughout the Spring and Fall seasons, we hosted 24 groups over 54 days, totaling more than 3800 guests.


