What is Measles?

Measles is a highly contagious virus that spreads through the air when someone coughs or sneezes. It starts like a cold—fever, cough, runny nose, red eyes—then a rash appears.

! Why It's Serious:

Measles can cause ear infections, pneumonia, brain swelling, and even death— especially in young kids, pregnant women, and people with weak immune systems.



How It Spreads:

- Through the air and on surfaces
- Contagious 4 days before and after the rash
- It can linger in a room for 2 hours

- 2 doses = 97% protection
- Safe and effective
- First dose at 12-15 months
- Second dose at 4-6 years
