Maine CDC Breast and Cervical Health Program (MBCHP)

MBCHP pays for

breast and cervical cancer screenings

(like mammograms and Pap/HPV tests) for people who qualify and identify as female, nonbinary, or transgender.

Do I qualify?

You may qualify if you:

- Are a Maine resident, age 40* or older;
- Have no health insurance or a high deductible; and
- Meet income guidelines (less than or equal to 250% of Federal Poverty Level)
- * Limited openings for those aged 35-39 who have seen a doctor and need more tests for possible breast or cervical cancer OR who have not had a Pap test in five or more years.

What services does MBCHP cover?

If you see an MBCHP participating health care provider, the program pays for:

- Breast Exams
- Pelvic Exams (internal exams)
- Pap Tests
- HPV Tests
- Mammograms (breast x-rays)
- Some Diagnostic or Follow-Up Services

Who should get screened for breast and cervical cancer?

MBCHP serves those who meet program eligibility requirements and identify as female, nonbinary, or transgender.

Breast Cancer Screening

Transgender women who have taken/are taking hormones, and transgender men who have not undergone a 100% bilateral mastectomy.

Cervical Cancer Screening

Transgender men who have not undergone a total hysterectomy (i.e., still have a cervix).

How long will I have MaineCare?

You'll have MaineCare as long as you:

- Are being treated for breast or cervical cancer or precancer;
- Have no other health insurance; and
- Are between 35-64 years old.

MBCHP will review your case each year.
