OUTDOOR LEADERSHIP

Our new Outdoor Leadership program has had a busy year, hiking, paddling, riding, exploring and more. The program prepares individuals to work as educators, instructors, or facilitators in parks, recreational facilities, camps, and other outdoor settings. Instruction has included leadership skills, wilderness survival skills, first aid, Global Positioning Systems (GPS), group processes, environmental studies and ethics, as well as instruction in recreational activities such as backpacking, kayaking, canoeing, and ropes course.

The students have had behind the scenes tours of Saddleback Mt. and what it takes to run the facility, learned to construct their own paddles, first aid training, and have even spent some time with a dogsled team to learn the art of mushing.
