A MESSAGE FROM THE SUPERINTENDENT

First and foremost, Mt. Blue Regional School District (RSU 9) continues to send positive thoughts to all within our communities affected by the terrible flooding last week. We know that events such as this hit many, if not all, aspects of peoples' home and work lives, creating difficulties in taking care of basic needs and adding a layer of worrying about family members and friends. We know that there may be far reaching effects for the weeks and months ahead and will support all through caring and understanding.

To try and help in the immediate aftermath of the storm, we opened Mt. Blue Campus (MBC) to anyone in need and had approximately 30 families use MBC as a shelter over the three days we were open to get a hot shower, enjoy a meal or two, feel some warmth or sleep. If you or someone you know continues to need help in dealing with the effects of this storm please contact your school's principal, social worker, or counselor to see if we can help. Only through all of us continuing to pull together will we be able to come out better on the other side of this terrible disaster.

On a happier note, I am pleased to share that the efforts of RSU 9 students, families, and staff continue to support improved student attendance this school year. In the seven weeks before the student break, RSU 9 students attended over 5,000 more school days than they did in the previous year during the same timeframe and reduced our absentee rate from 11.41% to 6.37%. An improvement of 44%! Our number of chronically absent students also reduced by 59% from 1,159 to 472. Wow!

Our improved numbers are a result of everyone's efforts to work together to make sure our students take advantage of the time, resources, and people they have available to them at our schools. Thanks go to everyone for their positive support in helping our students be at school! Through the generosity of the communities of Mt. Blue Regional School District and the State of Maine, we have much to offer our students and are excited that our students are taking more advantage of it!

Finally, I want to send my best wishes to each of you for a healthy, happy, and peaceful New Year!
