Monday, April 8th will be an Early Release Day. Grades 6-12 students will be dismissed at 11:30 AM, followed by Grades PreK – 5 students being dismissed at 12:30 PM.

Like us, many districts in the area and across the state share concerns about students being on buses during the time of the eclipse, and bus drivers being able to manage both student excitement and ensuring safety.

Franklin County Emergency Management Officials, along with local PD, Fire, Ambulance, and Franklin Memorial Hospital staff are also worried about the potential for added problems that may be caused by an expected increase in traffic this day, especially between the hours of 2 to 4 pm. No one knows for sure what traffic will be like because of visitors, and how that could impact our afternoon transportation.
