It's been a busy winter in RSU 9, filled with a wide array of activities and achievements with our students! We have enjoyed captivating music and drama performances that showcased the immense talent within our schools. Our robotics teams and other clubs have been actively engaged in enriching and educational experiences demonstrating student skill and expertise. And all of our winter sports teams worked hard with some achieving athletic championships and sportsmanship recognition! We are proud of each and every student who chose to represent Mt. Blue with their commitment and dedication! Special thanks go to our coaches, advisors, and volunteers for supporting these student opportunities!

We experienced a relatively mild winter with minimal snow days, but unfortunately we have seen Mother Nature play tricks with us the last three weeks. Let's all hope that spring will arrive next week!

RSU 9 recently held a referendum vote regarding the Maine Connectivity Authority Grant to purchase the Ingalls School for a potential new location for a family and student centered support hub while also looking at ways to increase CTE programming at Mt. Blue Campus. While the referendum did not pass, we want to acknowledge the many efforts put forth by everyone involved and thank those who voted for taking part in the democratic process. Please know we will continue to explore avenues to build better student and family supports in our region.

Behind the scenes, our budget committee and administrators have been working on the FY 26 budget for several months. This past Tuesday evening, we held a community forum to present the proposed budget to our community to receive valuable feedback. We appreciate and thank those who came or watched on Mt. Blue TV.

This coming Tuesday Evening, April 8th, the School Board will vote on whether to adopt the proposed budget to send it to the voters. We understand and appreciate that there are many needs within our communities and for our families and are pleased to report that the proposed budget reflects a small overall increase of 0.54%, with a 1.24% average increase to our towns. Our fiscal responsibility is crucial as we navigate the multiple needs of our students with the reality of funding questions being discussed in each of our towns, Augusta, and in DC. We have worked hard to minimize any impacts on student learning and services while identifying necessary reductions in the budget.

Please watch for the FY26 budget flyer in your mailbox this May. We encourage your participation in the Annual Budget Hearing on Tuesday, May 27th, 7:00 PM at the Bjorn Auditorium on the Mt. Blue Campus. The referendum vote will take place in each town on Tuesday, June 10th. Please check with your town for specific polling hours. We will also publish them during May.

Thank you for your continued support of the students and staff in RSU 9, we appreciate your positive partnership in our shared efforts. As our Mission says: We are "working together to provide high-quality educational opportunities for all."
