the first 25 student days of our school year I am happy to report that our average daily attendance has improved at each of our schools. Our overall attendance average has increased to 94.96% which means a decrease in absences from 6.47% to 5.04% and an increase in over 900 extra days of school attended by our students!. Each added day a student attends school is another opportunity for our staff to help them grow! Disconnected Youth?

As defined by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, <u>disconnected youth</u> are young people ages 14-24 who are homeless, in foster care, involved in the justice system, or are neither employed nor enrolled in an educational institution. Approximately 6.7 million or seventeen percent of all youth in this age range are currently considered disconnected. One way to help these young people is by providing them with occupational skills training leading to industry-recognized certifications, as well as opportunities for community service where they can learn valuable skills that will help them join the workforce and become successful adults.



In our area, the Central Western Maine Workforce Development Board is looking to find 16-19 year olds who are disconnected youth to support them. Franklin County is one of seven counties which comprise Central/ Western Maine. Franklin County appears to have less youth labeled as disconnected in this age range, compared to

many other Maine Counties. We believe this points to the effectiveness of the partnerships in Franklin County between high schools such as Mt. Blue and post-secondary planning, including Franklin County Adult Education/post-secondary schools, and many of our local companies all provide workforce development opportunities.
