Food Pantry: Mrs. Veayo's Alternative Learning program have been volunteering with the RSU9 Food Pantry for the last 4 months. They have been delivering backpacks to various schools, helped unload orders from the Good Shepard Food Bank to the Community Center, and then sort/organize for community pick-ups. They also made 16 loaves of bread which were shared with local families.

Impact Club: The IMPACT club has had a successful year, participating in events that strengthen our school's connection with the community. Our members are focused on making a positive difference through service projects and collaborations.

Accomplishments:

- Book Drive for Franklin Health Pediatrics: We organized a school-wide book drive, collecting and donating 133 books to Franklin Health Pediatrics, supporting literacy in our community
- **Read-a-thon**: Our annual Read-a-thon, with participation from IMPACT members and friends, raised \$612.00. This event promotes literacy and generates funds for future community projects.
- Rotary's "Price is Right" Event: IMPACT members provided backstage assistance at the Rotary's annual "Price is Right" event, supporting a community fundraiser.
- Franklin County Animal Shelter: We donated to and volunteered at the Franklin County Animal Shelter, showing our commitment to animal welfare and community support. We plan to make meaningful donations using the funds raised this year, hoping to have a positive impact on the community.
