#### D. 24-25 Budget Parameters

- 1. RSU 9 Strategic Plan
- 2. Where does the Board want the focus to be?
  - a) Portrait of a Grad focus-how we get there? Looking for aspirational but attainable goals for our students.
- 3. Discussion
  - a) What are the intentions?
    - (1) Asking for priorities from board members to include fiscal guidelines or focus areas.
    - (2) Difficult for some Board members to weigh in due to lack of details on potential budget increases.
    - (3) Board members do not have context in order to weigh in. It is helpful to have the numbers and ideas in a proposed budget in order to prioritize as a board.
    - (4) Given that there are things over which we don't have control, it is nice to know what is put forth and then make determinations.
    - (5) Educational excellence overall is the goal at the cost of not adding new programs.
    - (6) A focus on great staff is a priority.
    - (7) What are the items that we do have control over?

- (a) We will need to take a close look at them.
- (8) Superintendent shared:
  - (a) Last year's budget started at around 9% and we landed on 5.17%, which was approved by our voters.
  - (b) It is challenging to put together a budget that is too high and then have to pull back many of the hopes school admin may have.
  - (c) It could be a challenging budget for FY25 given built in costs. We are at 3.5% increase with the built in costs for salaries, benefits, and state funding.
  - (d) Special Education costs continue to rise, although we are seeking other revenue sources.
  - (e) It is important to note that each town is impacted differently by an overall budget increase.
