- 1. At today's recognition ceremony, Abbey Goodspeed received the Daughters of the American Revolution Award.

- 4. The National Honor Society Induction Ceremony went off smoothly last week with many students inducted.

- C. The Franklin County Retired Teachers gathering was held at MBC. The Culinary Arts Program catered the event with 50 members and Superintendent Elkington was in attendance.

- E. Our expanded collaboration with UMF has been welcomed by their staff. Ongoing meetings at this time are focused on putting New Teacher and Teacher Coach supports in place through a grant UMF received. Also looking at developing a professional development program together to serve RSU 9 professional and support staff.

 - 1. This is a fluid number. It was suggested that it would be important to differentiate the openings when sharing total numbers (teachers vs. coaching staff). There was a question about the long term substitute teachers in the MBHS Day Treatment Program.

IX. Administrator Reports

- A. Food Service Andy Hutchins
 - 1. With creative ordering, it looks like we will get through the milk carton shortage just fine.
 - 2. The Thursday before Thanksgiving, the food service program held its Thanksgiving meal. At AHS, the meal was celebrated in fine fashion with special tablecloths, etc.
 - 3. School Nutrition is breaking records at each school with meal participation.
 - 4. The summer training was a great success with lots of learning and collaboration. A shout out to the fire department and to Vicky

Gerstenberger, nurse at MBC, for sharing their assistance and expertise.

- 5. The fresh fruit and vegetable grant is going very well at all elementary schools.
- 6. A shout out to Rob Olsen and students in the Metal Fabrication program for their help with a creative project.
- 7. How might students be involved in food preparation? Snap Ed works to provide this opportunity, and the proposed future project for a regional center at MBC may provide for this as well.
- 8. What supports are there in place for locally sourced foods? RSU #9 was given \$9,000 this year from the federal government for this purpose. The State of Maine will reimburse at 100% for foods grown in Maine. There are also smaller supports in place for locally grown foods. Farm to School grants are available, but they are sometimes difficult to navigate, and it is a challenge to find time to complete them. One central location for meal prep would assist in working most closely with local farmers for efficiency's sake. It was suggested to consider collaborating with surrounding districts.
- 9. A "Shout out" to Andy for his commitment to the program and a "Shout out" to our food service staff at all schools!
- B. McKinney Vento Amanda Clark
 - 1. Amanda reviewed the numbers identified, which totals 38 as of today.
 - 2. Most are identified as doubled up (living with a friend or family member for financial reasons).
 - 3. The collaboration with all schools has been wonderful and supportive.
 - 4. DHHS is offering an opportunity to strengthen our communities (noted in the newsletter)-please join in!
 - 5. A great success this fall occurred with a collaboration with CMP and a family in need.
 - 6. There are some new funds available to support our students identified as McKinney Vento at \$750 per student. There are varied allowable uses that will need to be followed.
 - 7. Some families do not want to identify as McKinney-Vento. Our focus is on creating relationships with families and school staff to best support students.
 - 8. Unaccompanied youth are identified as those not living with their parents. They might be living with other adult family members or could be students who have been kicked out or have chosen to leave home.
 - 9. We partner unofficially with many local organizations in support of our unhoused students.

- 11. We are working through a complicated matter with a McKinney-Vento situation, and strong knowledge of the law has been helpful.
- 12. We see this as a need that will continue to increase and will require resources going forward.
