What is a comprehensive emergency plan?

 A system that addresses all aspects of emergency prevention, preparedness, response, recovery, and mitigation.

 It's the districts guide for hazardous situations and how to manage them.

What does the law require?

- A. State Statute- Pursuant to MRSA 20-A, Chapter 101, §1001, 16
- B. School boards will approve a comprehensive emergency plan on an annual basis.
- C. This plan will deal with all hazards and potential hazards that could reasonably be expected.
- D. Generalized emergency information is shared with the public.

Who should be involved?

 Statute requires school administration to work closely with state, county and local public safety officials to prepare, identify and deal with hazards within the district.

 The RSU #9 Safety Committee includes all these agencies and meets on a bi-monthly basis to address needs and relevant information.

What do general comprehensive emergency plans cover?

1. Mitigation and Prevention

- a. Safety plans
- b. Violence prevention
- c. Safety drills
- d. Avoid, Deny, Defend

2. Preparedness

- a. Emergency planning
- b. Safety committee
- c. Emergency supplies

3. Response

- a. Emergency drill procedures
- b. Staging areas
- c. Communication protocols

4. Recovery

- a. Crisis Team
- b. Emotional management of staff/students
- c. Incident After Action Review(AAR)

Description, scope, purpose and process of plans

 Plans are unique to individual buildings and the staff present within those facilities.

- The plans cover the four core areas within all comprehensive emergency plans which include:
 - Prevention
 - Preparedness
 - Response
 - Recovery

Yearly updates and auditing

- Each building plan is updated before the start of the new school year.
- All plans are collected within a district wide depository for access.
- Updates continue to be made at the building level if not substantial to account for changing hazards
- 4. RSU #9 safety team along with county Emergency Management Agency(EMA) meet regularly to discuss district safety needs and grant opportunities. (\$27,000+ last 3 years)

Roles, responsibilities and chain of command

- Administrative teams works together to ensure proper management of all emergencies.
- Superintendent is the district media agent.
- 3. Building administrators manage all building based activities
 - a. Lockdown Drills
 - b. Lockout Drills
 - c. Evacuation Drills
 - d. Distribution of materials
 - e. Relocation

How do we communicate during event?

- 1. Power Announce
 - a. Parent
 - b. Students
 - c. Staff
- 2. School and district websites
- 3. Social media platforms
 - a. Facebook
 - b. Twitter
- Reciprocity with other districts to ensure safe communication, transportation and evacuation if needed.
