Community School Update

Addressing our Pillar of Expanded and Enriched Learning Time and Opportunities

Based on our *Community Needs Assessment* given last Spring, the Community School Leadership Team identified one of the top needs was to offer parents safe childcare and enrichment opportunities for their children.

We have met this goal by using our grant funds to hire a Before and After School Care Coordinator. We now offer families Before School Care starting at 7 AM. We have approximately 26 students in this program with 6 of them receiving a scholarship. We offer an After School Care Club until 4:30 PM. We have approximately 35 students that have accessed this program. Students in Care Club are offered a snack, movement break and their choice of enrichment opportunities.
